Letter from Pastor Tim Wrenn

Opportunities

Opportunities come in all shapes and sizes: some of them have much more at stake than others, but nevertheless, it can seem like every other if not every day there is an opportunity to seize. Do you have any that come to mind lately?

Ever since moving to Marietta, I have found that opportunities abound. There is so much to do and see that it can be overwhelming. I find sometimes there is so much to take in that we miss tending the home fires. Other times we get caught up in the busyness of life that we forget about these opportunities coming our way.

One of the opportunities that I have recently come upon is the chance to take a study trip walking in the footsteps of the Apostle Paul. The trip is named "In Search of Paul." It is run through an organization called LEAD out of the Gulf Coast Synod of the ELCA. Our group will be spending 15 days moving through Turkey and Greece, stopping and staying at many of the cities in which and to which Paul wrote his letters. Paul is attributed to many of the books of the New Testament and is a very important figure in the writings of Martin Luther along with the whole Christian church. This is a great opportunity for me to deepen my understanding of the context to which Paul was writing.

During this period of time, I will be away from the congregation. I give thanks for

all the support I have already found in considering this opportunity, especially from Rachel who will bear much of the load at home. During this time our ministry care team will be available in case of emergency or any pastoral care needs. This team is made up of Julie Ridings, Rev. Dr. Mark Ellingsen, and Denny Buehner.

Making the decision to take a trip of this length, while a great opportunity, did not come easy. I could easily think of all the reasons why I should not go or why this was a bad idea: the security of the location, leaving Rachel to be a single parent towards the end of her semester, the financial cost of the trip. And then I remembered a quote from a previous continuing education (ironic, I know). It comes from Paul's second letter to Timothy (also ironic, I know); "For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but rather a spirit of power and of love and of self-discipline." **2 Timothy 1:7**

So I leaned into what Paul said, taking the opportunity, trusting in God's Spirit. And it has been amazing to see how God has used people in this community to ease my hesitations and help me to lean in even more to this trip. If you are finding yourselves struggling with an opportunity, it is helpful to remember that our God empowers us to be bold and trust that as we move forward God will give us what—and who—we need to press on.

The next meeting of the Social Ministry Committee is Tuesday, March 14th at 7 PM. We will be having a guest speaker. She will be introducing us to Family Promise of Cobb County. After her presentation, we will discuss our responsibility for the March 29th Lenten Supper: Pasta Night. We presently have an initiative we will be undertaking beginning on Ash Wednesday:

Pink Piggy Banks for the ELCA World Hunger Appeal.

We will be passing out the pink piggies after Wednesday's service. Our hope is that church members will take a pig for a Lenten Discipline activity. The goal is to try to collect \$30 in each pig because that is how much it costs to buy a piglet for a poor family. "When this little piggy grows up, she will give birth to as many as 16 piglets each year. Pigs help fertilize fields, provide food to eat and can be sold at market for much-needed income." Yes, we are hoping for \$30 in each pig. But as you are depositing change into your pig, think about what you might have gone without to have that spare change-- a soda, a bag of chips, and then think about what how that CHANGE can possibly CHANGE a family's lifestyle. **We will be**

In September 2006, Julia was sent as a missionary through the World Mission Prayer League to Kenya. The WMPL has 100 Lutheran missionaries serving in 20 different countries across the world. It was while serving in the Samburu region of North Kenya that Julia met her husband, Vincent Leiyoole. They married here at Christ Lutheran in June 2010 while on sabbatical from their missionary work in and around the village of Arsim in North Kenya. Together, with God's help, they work tirelessly to meet the spiritual, physical, medical, & emotional needs of the rural communities around them.

Over the years Julia has focused on leadership development among women of the ELCK (Evangelical Lutheran Church of Kenya), development of addiction recovery programs, orphan sponsorship, & development of women's sewing businesses. Vincent has started the *Wheels of Progress* program and is working with UBuild2 in rural community development. In addition to these endeavors, the Leiyoole team continues to spread the Good News through bible studies & most recently a well-received worship and praise event in a good old southern revival format.

All of which to say, these 2 Christ Lutheran family members have been extremely busy in their missionary work abroad! But don't just take it from me, be sure to ask them yourselves when they come for our CLC family reunion this summer]
