2020 was filled with unexpected events, changes, and loss driven mostly by the COVID-19 pandemic. We have always sought to make decisions regarding our church's response to the pandemic based on:

*Jesus' command to love our neighbors as ourselves.

*Methodist founding father John Wesley's rules for Christian living to 1) do no harm, 2) do good, and 3) stay in love with God.

*Recommendations from our national, state, and local public health officials.

Keeping these principles in mind, after reviewing the current COVID-19 situation in our community, Clinton UMC leadership has made the decision to re-open the church building to in-person gatherings beginning **January 10**. Face coverings will continue to be required in the church building. Appropriate social distancing will need to be maintained as well. For worship services this will mean sitting in every other pew, which will have pew pads.

For the time being, there will only be one "in-person" Sunday worship service at 8:15 a.m. The service will continue to be available virtually on our Facebook page (@UMCClintonMO) and on the radio (KDKD, 95.3 FM and 1280 AM).

Please continue to be in prayer for our congregation, our church leaders, and our people. Pray for each other. Pray that as 2021 begins, Clinton UMC will continue to live into our mission "to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

I look forward to gathering with you for worship in-person, online, or on the radio this Sunday morning at 8:15! We'll begin a new sermon series called "Tough Love." When it comes to God, how tough could love really be? Think about the cross.
