UMW Meeting Tomorrow!

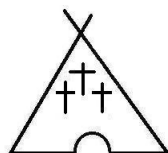
Martha Nichols will present "Ancestry: Researching Families of our Past" on Friday, May 14 at 9:30 in the **Sanctuary- (room change!)**
