Hey Graduating Seniors!


Two things!

Learn About Alzheimer's Research!

Next **Thursday**, **May 18th at 5:30 PM** in the Back Room here at church, come join the Henry County Memory Fund as we hear progress in Alzheimer's disease research and the vital role of those who participate in studies in helping to overcome the disease.

A free light meal will be served.

The presenter is Andrea Denny, JD, LCSW, an instructor in Neurology at the School of Medicine at Washington University in St. Louis. The Knight Alzheimer's Disease Research Center at Wash U is partially funded by the Henry County Memory Fund each year. This center works to find ways to treat and ultimately prevent Alzheimer's Disease and related dementias, as well as improved diagnosis and care for people with these diseases.
