From the Pastor:

I recently read an article (online) that was titled, "10 Things that Ain't Church." It was written by Carey Nieuwhof; about whom I know nothing else.

The article addressed many things, good things in which Christian people participate, like Bible study, individual or family devotions, social gatherings of church people, podcasts or online worship. The writer recognized good in these practices, but noted how much of what we slide towards (usually because it's easier) falls short of actually being church, partly because reality is messy.

Granted, I'm paraphrasing freely, and leaving out much of the offered support for the views published, but that's probably because what this author wrote resonates with me.

Historically, many critiqued the church because they expected that church people ought to be more righteous than they actually were. They accused us of hypocritical, being because sinners sat in the pews alongside everyone else. Apparently they were only counting certain sins, because I guarantee "everyone else" had their own share of sins that may merely have been less visible (or more accepted in society).

It was good when churches began responding with claims of being a place for forgiveness of sin, rather than as a gathering of the righteous, but it isn't only one or the other. Church is a gathering of human people striving to experience God's love for everyone, AND striving to share that love with everyone...

So...

We are here for God's forgiveness and to live in God's righteousness.

This does NOT mean that we have found one way to be righteous, with specific rules that everyone must follow in exactly the same way. What is means is that as we are confronted in life, we are free to respond without fearing God's condemnation.

Why, then, do we continue to condemn one another? (I'm not talking about the criminal justice system, there is a place for that, I'm talking about church.)

Why do we snub and shun others who venture into our worship spaces?

Why do we allow those who snub or shun us to keep us away from these worship spaces dedicated to God?

Church is a messy place, full of people whose sins may be different than our own. Yet God still loves all of us with our



different sins. God forgives these different sins. God encourages us to let go of the sins of others, so that we can share God's love with one another.

There are many things that support our church life, like Bible study, social gatherings and devotions, along with online resources from podcasts sermons and even some memes. They cannot however replace this messy gathering of forgiven coming together sinners proclaim a love that supersedes They cannot quite all that. comprise the church, because they excise much of the mess, and therefore, are not fully real.

Church brings forgiveness, and gives us an avenue to reach out with God's love for everyone. In Jesus' name.

Notes.....

I pray that you may enjoy good health and that all may go well with you." (3 John 1:2)

June is not only known for graduations and Father's Day, but also for National Men's Health Month. And that's a good time to focus on important some facts. According to the Men's Health Network, "American men live sicker and die than American younger women." Did you know that 115 males are conceived for every 100 females? On the other hand, 3/5 of all Sudden Syndrome Death Infant (SIDS) victims are boys. Men suffer hearing loss at 2x the rate of women. Testosterone is linked to elevations of LDL (the bad cholesterol), and declines in HDL (the good cholesterol). As a result, 211 men out of every 1000 died of heart disease in 2014 compared to 132 women. Men also have fewer infection-fighting Tcells and are thought to have weaker immune systems than And women are women. 100% more likely to visit the doctor for annual examinations and preventive services than men. So by the 100. women age outnumber men eight to one!

But men CAN live healthier and longer just by knowing their health threats and how to break through those risks. A healthy, balanced diet will greatly reduce the risk for 5 of the top 10 threats: heart disease. cancer. stroke. diabetes, and kidney disease. Take a look at your health habits. think about recommendations for healthy living, and find areas that you can change for the better. Don't smoke, be physically active eat a balanced diet, maintain a healthy weight, manage your stress, take precautions, safety take medications as needed, and participate in health screenings. That may sound like a long list but it's not complicated.

Now for you women, you are often more likely to notice changes in your family

members' health status than they are. In Genesis 2:18, God says, "It is not good that man should be alone. I will make him a helper as his partner." Looking out for the health of the men in our lives is part of our role as women. And doing this is for our own good as well as theirs! Women outlive men by more than 5 years on average. Women are more likely to be the care-takers of their husbands rather than the reverse. And more than half the elderly widows now living in poverty were not poor before the death of their husbands.

So for all you men, know your body, listen to its' needs, listen to your wife, and see your physician when things do not seem right. Your families want a future with you! Look at your life and see what can be changed. A few simple adjustments can give you better health and longer

Recently, I heard that Pastor Randy Olson had been to Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Billings Park. It was then that I heard he had become involved as assistant to the Bishop of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin in 2018. He concentrates on leadership, call process, candidacy, and Bridge Builders.

Why am I writing about him? He grew up as a member of Concordia. He is the son of Bud and Aloise Olson. I remember him as a Sunday School Teacher. As in charge of the Sunday School at the time, we all considered him to be an excellent teacher. Gary Banker remembers Randy as the little brother of Chris and Carol. He remembers him specificly when Carol, Julie Polglase, and he did a Christmas Pageant for Concordia. They blended Sunday School Children and adults in the performance. Each adult had a significant speech to memorize and as one of the characters involved in the story of Jesus' birth. Randy was their Roman Centurion. Probably in high school at the time, he took his role seriously and wore an appropriate outfit. To do that took guts and commitment. As he did everything he was asked to do, it was always with a smile on his face. That is how Gary remembers Randy.

Our pastors at the time were Lindley Jacobson and Roger O. Livdahl. They both thought Randy would be a dedicated pastor because of his sincere faith and Christian attitude. They were correct.

Randy graduated from Senior High in 1976. He went to Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota. He graduated in 1980. He then attended Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota and graduated in 1986. He did receive the Boe-Engebretson Scholarship from church.

Pastor Olson's internship took place at Peace Lutheran Church in Puyallup, Washington in 1984-1985. Other churches he ministered in are the following:

Associate Pastor in Parma Lutheran Church in Parma, Ohio during 1986-1990.

Mission Developer at Celebration Lutheran Church in Chardon, Ohio in 1990-2000.

Pastor of First Lutheran Church in Cumberland, Wisconsin in 2000-2004.

Senior Pastor in Hope Lutheran Church in Eau Claire, Wisconsin in 2004-2012. Senior Pastor at Faith Lutheran Church, Clive, Iowa in 2012-2018.

He became assistant to the Bishop, Northwest Synod of Wisconsin in 2018.

Pastor and his wife, Mary, have been married for 39 years and have two grown sons and three grandchildren and presently live on Island Lake in Solon Springs.

I believe as members of Concordia who knew Pastor Olson, we are very proud of him and what he has accomplished and that he continues to work for the glory of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Mike Christian provided an update on his progress. Currently he is working on drilling holes into plexiglass boards which will become diode matrix boards. A total of 4,278 holes will be drilled into 28 boards for mounting the diodes. Mike and his son like to relax and "unwind" by spending a few hours drilling holes in the evenings. Once the drilling is complete, assembly will begin, which mounting includes and soldering segments.

It is!

Simply Giving is a way to simplify your regular offering so that it arrives safely at Concordia even when you're unable to come. It can be used for one-time offerings or for regular weekly or monthly giving.

You don't even need to have email! I know. I just finished scheduling an offering for a Sunday that I will be gone on vacation, and deliberately left the email box blank, and it worked.

You can have the offering deducted directly from your checking or savings account, or routed through a credit or debit card. You can even designate how you want the offering applied, whether to general fund,

memorials, missionary sponsorship, etc.

To set this up, you can click on this box on our web page www.concordiasuperior.org:



We can help you to do this in the office as well (and some Sundays we may have a station set up in the worship space for those who wish to sign up and who are uncomfortable using computers). You'll need routing and account numbers or a credit card. You will be able to print out a receipt.

If you wish to set this up for your regular giving, you can still put your (empty) envelope into the offering plate if you wish. Just write on the envelope that you've given electronically. Or include an additional offering if you'd like.


