By the time you read this, I'll have returned from vacation. Due date for articles is while I'm gone, so I suppose I should be letting this go as a task from which I'm taking vacation! (See how well that went...

)

How do we rest? People today seem to have an ever more difficult time resting.

Some cannot rest well because they work several jobs to keep up with obligations.

Some cannot rest well because one's particular job is overly demanding.

Some cannot rest well because even down time is filled with worries about what might be happening when one is not there.

Some cannot rest well because we've habitualized the chemical assistance of alcohol or other aids to try to relax.

Some cannot rest well because others nag at them to help with this, that, or the other thing!

Some cannot rest well because everything hurts...

Some cannot rest well because they've learned from society that resting is considered to be laziness, or lack of motivation, or some other undesirable trait.

God knew this to be a tendency of humanity. God provided specifically for rest, not particularly in terms of long vacations, but as a regular thing that happens in life. God commanded that every seventh day is to be a day of rest, not only for the righteous, not only for the religious, but even for the slaves, the foreigners, and the poor.

I mourn the loss of the summer break we enjoyed between school terms as children. I mourn that today we seem to schedule ourselves and our children so tightly that there seems to be no time to fit one more thing into the schedule. I mourn the loss of Sundays being reserved for church and church activities.

Yet, I also celebrate. I celebrate the truth that God does not forget us as we over-regiment our time. I celebrate that we are still encouraged to step back from our busy-ness and rest. I celebrate that Sabbath itself does not require us to deny good things that ought to happen no matter what day it happens to be.

I've been to the emergency room for myself four different times, and each of them included procedure or surgery on a Sunday. I am eternally thankful that the doctors, nurses, and other technicians did not refuse to work that day because it was a Sunday!



I further celebrate the fact that people who do gather for worship, whether it be Sunday morning or any other day or time, are there for some other reason than that there is nothing else to do!

Remember, when we are resting, God is there. When we are so busy we can hardly think straight, God is there. Rejoice in the beauty that surrounds you, whether it be nature or artistic décor, whether it be vast or cozy. Allow yourself to take time to remember that God walks with you through life, that God loves you—giving life to you, and giving up life for you. Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say rejoice. (Philippians 4:4)
