From the Pastor:

Stop. Take a moment. Breathe. Do it again.

Immanuel is the word from the Hebrew Scriptures meaning "God is with us." Emmanuel is that same word transliterated into Greek, still meaning, "God is with us."

Stop. Take a moment. Breathe.

God is with us.

Let your heart acknowledge this truth:

God is with us.

There is a story of a community of faith needing to choose a new leader. As they considered what to make their highest priority, they seized on the Bible verse that advises to "pray without ceasing." (1 Thessalonians, 5:17) They decided that their ideal leader would be the one who could best demonstrate the ability to pray without ceasing.

I'm sorry I wasn't able to find the source, in order to explain the parable more correctly, and to give proper credit to the author. It says something like this:

The challenge was offered to three contestants for the leadership position, and was to last for seven days. One set up space in the chapel, arranged for food to be brought in at regular intervals, and arranged several cushions and kneeling rails to aid with the posture of prayer for the week.

The second created a pavilion of sorts outdoors, in a popular site, praying loudly at times, and more quietly at others, occasionally asking those passing by for needs to be included in the prayers solemnly intoned.

The third did not appear to make any effort at all. There was no space set aside for praying. Meals were as before, sometimes solitary and at home, sometimes in the community and shared with others. Those who believed this one to be the best possible leader for the community anxiously began urging some kind of effort be taken, but the third merely smiled and took up

another task. One task was helping to weed the garden of a lonely neighbor, coupled with quiet conversation.

Another was helping to round up the critters who had somehow escaped from the safety of their yard. When a stranger came to town and tripped on the tree root



that the regulars had learned to avoid, this one assisted with first aid, and transportation to additional medical assistance.

At the end of the week, the first two showed up at the meeting exhausted, both believing they must have won, while the third quietly took a seat in the back. Each gave a report of their week, and the committee withdrew to discuss. The decision was unanimous. The one who had prayed best was the one who recognized the needs of the community, and worked best to fulfill them: the third.

Prayer is not limited to what we say to God, or ask of God. Prayer includes what God says to us, and asks of us. It seems that many people find it too difficult to take the time to listen, to be.

Stop. Take a moment. Breathe.

Much in this world is unfair. Most of us have become reactionary, without taking the time to consider what God may be doing within the chaotic mess of a world filled with people (and others!) who act without prayer, without seeing God's presence or God's creation.

Stop. Take a moment. Breathe. Pray. God is with us, always!

Parish Nursing Notes......

We received a letter from our Family Practice physician lately, as I know several other members of our congregation did. It told us that our doctor had been diagnosed with stage 4 pancreatic cancer, with some metastasis to the liver. Our immediate though was, "This must be a mistake!

She's a doctor! How could this sneak up on her like that!"

But the fact is, she's also a person, just like us. And just like us, symptoms sneak up on us. We think they're not really serious, and will pass on. They seem so minor that they can't possibly mean anything we should follow up on. But sometimes we should!

The pancreas lies deep inside the body, and has two main functions: secrete juices that help digest foods, and make hormones that help control blood sugar levels. Early tumors in the pancreas are very difficult to detect. But people are advised to consult their doctor if they have any of the five common symptoms.

There are five early symptoms that should catch our attention—and they may not all appear at the same time. One of those symptoms is jaundice. This is a yellow tint you might notice in the whites of your eyes, your skin, or your urine. This happens when some of the bile ducts get blocked, and the bile (and its' yellow color) follow different paths.

Blocked bile ducts can also lead to light colored and greasy stools. So it's a good idea to look in the toilet before you flush it.

Pain in your belly or your back can also result from blocked ducts. Pain in those areas can result from many other problems as well, so we do not usually think of a cancer as the cause. And we think it is something minor and will go away in a few days.

A decreased appetite and resulting weight loss is another early symptom. This can come on so gradually you may not notice it for quite a while. And for many of us, the weight loss might be something we LIKE seeing, and not even question the reason behind it!

The fifth symptom is nausea and vomiting. Usually if we experience those symptoms we think it is due to something we ate, or possibly a light case of the flu.

If you notice two or more of these symptoms at the same time you should schedule an appointment with your doctor to get them checked out. Or even if it's only ONE of the symptoms, but it lasts for two weeks or longer—get it checked out. It may turn out to be nothing serious, and you'll have to pay for an extra office visit. But that is so much less than NOT getting it checked, and finding out later that you have pancreatic cancer. And then have to pay for all the expenses that will involve. And also have a much shorter life span, as less than 9% of people with pancreatic cancer live five years or longer.

1 Cor. 6:19-20 tells us to honor God with our bodies, and to care for them, and Proverbs tells us that a wise man listens to advice. So DO these things and stay healthy and happy so that you may help others.....Jean
