## From the Pastor:

Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ, our leader.

For those of you not yet aware of my personal circumstances, I recently received a diagnosis of a new cancer in the same breast where cancer was removed four years ago. Because it is a new kind rather than recurrent, coupled with a very strong family history, we have decided that a bilateral mastectomy without reconstruction is the best way to move forward. This means that recovery is expected to be quick (three weeks), and there will be less chance of any future cancers of the breast (and any that do occur should be much easier to discover).

Because of all this, you will notice that we will have pulpit supply on February 27, March 6, and March 13. A supply pastor will also be here on Ash Wednesday to preside over Holy Communion for those who choose to be in the building for worship at noon.

Our Lenten Worship Series this year is "Holy Everything," and is provided by the synod staff of the Northwestern Synod of Wisconsin. It will be shown on the walls in our worship space each Wednesday (Thursday and Friday in Holy Week) at noon (and available from that point on through our Facebook page).

On Ash Wednesday, we will have ashes available for those in the worship space. Those worshiping from home (whether at noon or at a later time), will be invited to use either water or oil to mark the cross on their foreheads. (Please be sure to use an oil that is safe for use on the skin. Many of the "essential oils" marketed today contain irritants that can cause rashes on the skin. Olive or vegetable oils are fine.)

March 9 will be framed by the practice of "Lament." We will reflect on Psalm 22, and dig deeper into our grief, consider the things we have lost or that leave us feeling worried or weary. We are encouraged to have a piece of paper or a journal and something with which to write for this experience.

March 16 will cover the "Daily Examen," using the 5 steps of reflection created by Ignatius of Loyola: Stillness, Thankfulness, Reflection, Prayer, and Hope.

March 23 will include a technique of silent prayer, providing space to consider God's presence with us. We will be invited to consider a sacred word which will guide our time and thoughts.

March 30 will focus on "Dwelling in the Word," reflecting on Psalm 42, and using



a method of listening and reflecting on what we hear and what God is sharing through these words.

**April 6** will be on "Blessing Prayer," with intentionality in thought, prayers, and visualization.

Maundy Thursday (April 14) will include Holy Communion, and participants are encouraged to have a candle, water, bread, wine or grape juice, and a cross. (These are already provided for those who will be present in Concordia's worship space!)

Good Friday (April 15) will include thoughtful consideration for Jesus' sacrifice, his death on the cross for each one of us. We will observe **Tenebrae**, a service of mediation on Christ's suffering. Having seven candles that can be extinguished during the experience may be helpful.

Blessings for all of us this Lenten Season! Pastor Michelle



**PARISH NURSING NOTES** 

This month we're looking ahead to experiencing Lent. And people often focus on what food they have "given up" for Lent. And that is fine. But there are other considerations too. Lent is a particularly good time to remind ourselves that our bodies and spirits are intimately connected. And our bodies need more than food to flourish. They also need some exercise. And one good way to exercise is walking. So Lent is a good time to involve walking as well.

Some of the spiritual benefits are time for prayer, marveling in the body God created, giving thanks for the world God created, sharing time with a companion walker, a sense of stewardship for God's gift of life. It is a time to get away from the demands of our daily routines, and to reflect and pray, and be near to God.

A walking program has physical benefits while also drawing us closer to God by adding an intentional reflective element. Stepping away ( literally) from the demands of our daily routines to walk, reflect, and pray reminds us that God created us and wants to be near to us.

I love walking outside, in nature, in the beauty of God's creation. But walking outside in winter, especially in our part of the country, tends to make me focus more on the cold temperature and the ice on the ground. But walking can be done indoors as well. And that

is one of the benefits of living at New Perspectives. There are many carpeted hallways, on three floors, with railings on each side, to safely walk in comfort—without having to bundle up in coats and boots and scarves! And you always meet others to stop and exchange a few words with, and meet new people.

I recommend starting with a brief prayer, and then starting on your way. Along the way, you can continue to offer short prayers, of thankfulness and gratitude, or asking for guidance. We always stop at the end of each hall to look out the windows, and marvel at the beauty and activity we see. It's not the beautiful trees and river we would see at our house. But it is always interesting.

Walking was a main form of transportation during Biblical times, and the Bible is full of stories of the journeys. It has been calculated that Jesus walked the equivalent of the circumference of the world based only on the journeys that are recorded in the Bible. That doesn't include all the miles He put on as a child growing up, or around the town in His adult years. We don't even come close to that!

Sacrificing a food you enjoy can help you feel connected to God during Lent. But so can a walk filled with spiritual reflections. Try it! Follow what is meaningful and works for you! "In God we live and move and have our being." (Acts 17:28).

## **Worship Aids for the Coming Weeks**

## Sunday, March 6, 1st Sunday in Lent

These forty days called Lent are like no other. It is our opportune time to return to the God who rescues, to receive the gifts of God's grace, to believe with the heart and confess with the mouth the wonder of God's love in Jesus, and to resist temptation at every turn. This is no small pilgrimage on which we have just embarked. It is a struggle Jesus knew. It is a struggle Jesus shares. The nearness of the Lord, in bread and wine, water and word, will uphold and sustain us.

**Prayer of the Day:** O Lord God, you led your people through the wilderness and brought them to the promised land. Guide us now, so that, following your Son, we may walk safely through the wilderness of this world toward the life you alone can give, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen

## Sunday, March 13, 2nd Sunday in Lent

By our baptism clothe us with garments of your grace, and feed us at the table of your love, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. 
