# Bible Studies January 2024 Wednesdays, 10:30-11:30

#### 01-03-24 Mark 1:21-45

- 1. What insight does verse 21 give into what a synagogue meeting was like? What do we learn here about Jesus' ministry?
- 2. What difference was there between his teaching and that of the scribes? How might his authority make His actual teaching look different?
- 3. Why do you think this demon possessed man went to this service? What might Satan have been trying to accomplish?
- 4. What did this demon admit that most people in Israel denied? What does this tell us about what true belief is?
- 5. Why might Jesus have told this demon to "be quiet?"
- 6. What do you think they expected of Jesus when they told Jesus about her fever?
- 7. What do we learn about Jesus from this passage?
- 8. Why do you think Jesus did not permit the demons to speak about his identity in verse 34?
- 9. How should Jesus' time of solitary prayer help us prioritize times of daily prayer in our busy and demanding schedules?
- 10. If Jesus is fully able to heal people from disease and deliver them from demonic oppression, why does he want to focus on preaching?

#### 01-10-24 Mark 2:1-22

- 1. What do each of the events recorded in this chapter have in common? Can you think of a common thread that links them all together?
- 2. Why did they go to such great effort for Jesus to see this paralytic?
- 3. Why do you think Jesus only said to the one man that his sins were forgiven instead of to all five? What did he see in that situation that we cannot?
- 4. In this passage what is the relationship between their faith and their works?
- 5. Which do you think is easier to say (verse 9) and why?
- 6. What insights into Jesus' character do you have from this passage?
- 7. Why did he choose someone he knew would be looked down on by most Jews?
- 8. What did the Pharisees think of Jesus' habit of associating with these types of people?
- 9. What was Jesus' explanation for this? What does this mean?
- 10. What other complaint did they have about Jesus? What do you think was their motivation for voicing this?

#### 01-17-24 Mark 4:1-34

- 1. Why is it a gift not only to hear but also to understand the Word of the Lord?
- 2. Why do you think Jesus used seeds in His parables?
- 3. What does Jesus want to teach us about God's Kingdom through these parables?
- 4. There are some surprising things about God's ways in this passage. Is there anything offensive to you in Jesus' parables or His explanation of them? If so, what? What does this reveal about our ways and God's ways?
- 5. Why do you think Jesus often taught by the sea?
- 6. Why did Jesus conclude his parable saying, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear?"
- 7. How might someone who is not spiritually sensitive respond to a parable they didn't understand?
- 8. Why was this group privileged to understand the mystery of the kingdom of God?
- 9. Why was it important to understand this parable as opposed to others?
- 10. How can we put our "lamp on the lampstand?" What is the opposite of doing this?

#### *01-24-24 Mark 5:1-20*

- 1. Who is treated in the way this anonymous man was treated today?
- 2. The man saw Jesus and begged to be left alone-why? Why would someone fear goodness?
- 3. How did the townspeople treat him, and do you think their treatment was appropriate?
- 4. What would happen to this man if he showed up in Superior?
- 5. Did the man himself, in spite of the demons, throw himself down in front of Jesus?
- 6. Why does the demon adjure Jesus "by God?" (Matt 8:29)
- 7. Why does Jesus engage the demon by asking his name?
- 8. Why did the demon fear being cast "out of the country?"
- 9. Why is this man told to "go and tell" rather than to remain silent?
- 10. Why does Jesus not allow this man to "be with him?"

#### 01-31-24 Mark 5:21-43

- 1. What was Jairus' request? What did this show about him?
- 2. How must she have felt suffering through this illness for 12 years?
- 3. Should she have kept seeing the physicians? Did this demonstrate a lack of faith?
- 4. What kinds of doubts or feelings toward God may have arisen in those 12 years?
- 5. What might this woman have learned during these 12 years?
- 6. Why did Jesus asked who touched Him? Did He not know the answer?
- 7. How did Jesus respond to the lady? What can we learn about his character from this?
- 8. How might Jairus have felt while all of this was going on?
- 9. How might Jairus and the people around reacted to Jesus' statement in verse 36?
- 10. How did Jesus respond to their derision? How should we respond when people laugh at us?


