04-03-24 Acts 1:1-14

1. What does Jesus do for the 40 days he is with his followers after his resurrection? Why do you think he chose this topic to teach?

2. Luke tells us in v. 3 that Jesus gave "many convincing proofs" that he was alive. Why is it essential that verse 3 establishes Jesus' resurrection as a proven historical fact?

3. What does this passage tell us about Jesus' identity and mission? What does it tell us about the Holy Spirit's identity and mission?

4. Jesus never meant for us to live for Him in our own power. But often, we try to live this life under our power or control. Why do we often try to live life on our own?

5. What does it mean to be a witness? What is expected from them?

6. What is the difference between bearing witness and being a witness?

7. Does knowing it is not your job to persuade or defend the gospel, but to simply report what you have experienced and know to be true make it easier to be a witness or harder? Why ?

8. Where and when are we to be witnesses?

9. Have you ever thought that maybe some of the difficulties you go through are providing a way for you to witness? How can our difficulties help us to witness?

10. Does the idea of failing or messing up in witnessing keep you from witnessing? Did you know that you don't need to fear this? Why don't we need to fear failing in witnessing?

04-10-24 Acts 3:1-10

Put yourself in the place of the beggar. What do you imagine that life would have looked like for you?
Look at how Peter and John responded to the man. Think about all that Peter and John had experienced over the past 60 days or so. What do you notice about Peter and John? What has changed in them?

3. What do you notice about the response of the people to the miracle?

- 4. Peter and John must have passed by this beggar many times. Why was this day different?
- 5. What's the first thing Peter said to the man? Why?

6. Describe Peter's demeanor in vv. 7-8. Does this remind you of anyone?

7. Why did the people recognize the beggar? Why were they surprised to see him walking and jumping and praising God in the temple courtyard?

8. What do you think was the beggar's most pressing physical need and most pressing spiritual need? How does Peter address both?

9. Do you think miracles like that can happen today? What do you think it takes for something like that to happen?

10. What did the man do when he realized he was healed? What do you think you would have done?

04-17-24 Acts 17:1-9; 1 Thess. 1:1-10

1. What was Paul's main preoccupation in the synagogue? How serious should we take the teaching of God's word?

- 2. What reactions were aroused from Paul's preaching of the gospel?
- 3. Is it normal for some people to get upset by the preaching of God's word? (John 6: 60-66, Mark 6:1-6)
- 4. What did the people mean when they said, "These who have turned the world upside down?"
- 5. How can we turn our world "upside down?"
- 6. Courage for Paul meant walking into situations where he knew it was just a matter of time before he experienced some kind of physical pain. While that may not be our experience in our

country, what does it look like to be a courageous Christian in America in 2024?

- 7. (thess.) What evidence did Paul find that the Thessalonians had responded to the gospel?
- 8. What do you think it means that the gospel came in power?
- 9. What do you think it means that the gospel came in the Holy Spirit?
- 10. What do you think it means that the gospel came with full conviction?

04-24-24 Acts 18:1-4; 1 Cor. 1:10-18

- 1. What were the things that God provided for Paul?
- 2. Why is it so crucial to have friends when going through a hard situation in life?
- 3. What is the first problem identified in the Corinthian church? What was causing the divisions?
- 4. Why were people divided by these kinds of things? What was God's will for them?
- 5. Why are there so many divisions in the church these days?
- 6. What should we do to limit divisions and reach for unity?
- 7. What do you notice about Paul's attitude in it as one of their leaders?
- 8. Why is Paul glad he didn't baptize many of the people?

9. From vs 17, what was the one thing that Paul was supposed to have done there and what were the two things he was not supposed to have done?

10. Do think there was a conflict or contradiction between what Paul understood

his mission to be and what Jesus told the disciples in Matt 28:19-20? Why or why not?
