On the first Sunday of this month we are still in the season of Lent, during which we leave out the alleluia's in the Divine Service in order to focus more on our sins and God's merciful promise to send us a Savior. We are reminded of these things in the first of our stained glass windows.



Then on the second Sunday of this month we begin our journey with Jesus' during Holy Week, which includes His death on Good Friday, highlighted by the crucifix.



Finally, on the third Sunday of this month we celebrate our Lord's glorious resurrection on Easter Sunday with the words: "He is risen! He is risen indeed!

## Redeemer Lutheran School Newsletter April 2022

Dear Members of Redeemer Lutheran, Thank you for being prayer warriors for the students, their families and our staff as we seek to do God's will in educating these children who have been entrusted to us. Redeemer Lutheran School is in the last quarter of our first year of educating elementary students in a Christ-centered culture. The staff is already working on the 2022-23 school year preplanning what curriculum is needed and recruitment opportunities for new students. Please help us get the word out about our OPEN HOUSE on TUESDAY, APRIL 5, from 5:00-7:00 pm.

Current Enrollment: 21 students (Kindergarten-Fifth Grade)

**School:** Our Kindergarten class is currently using the stained-glass windows in the sanctuary as object lessons in their Bible time. There is a hands-on 3-D follow up activity to help the kids remember the lessons. They are becoming amazing readers and writers. In science, the Kindergarteners are learning about God's world and animals.

Our first and second graders are becoming fluent readers while comprehending the stories they read. We are learning about nouns, completing the last "special" sounds in phonics, and diagramming sentences. In math we have learned to tell time to 5 minutes and are beginning to study fractions and double-digit addition with carrying. In Bible time, the children are continuing to write and illustrate in their Bible Journals while following the historical timeline since creation. Please come look at their journals to see all the stories they have learned so far. In science, we have been discovering God's world with special adaptations animals have, along with wheels, levers, and ramps.

Our third, fourth, and fifth grade students are working with mixed numbers and adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions; writing reports for language class; and studying earth science, with a trip planned to Sand Dunes National Park. We are reading and studying Bible stories included in the Gospels leading up to the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus and its life-changing impact for each of us.

**Testing:** Redeemer Lutheran School tested our students for National Testing, March 30-31. We are excited to see how our students compare academically with students across the nation. We anticipate having test scores by the end of the school year.

**Hot Lunches:** Thank you to Jenean, Sharon and Char for preparing delicious hot lunches every Wednesday that the kids devour.

**Share YOUR Talents:** A HUGE thank you to Mrs. Tracy Dickinson for spending her afternoons at RLS volunteering and teaching us amazing art lessons. If you are interested in sharing your talents, please contact any of the teachers!

## "Life Thoughts In The Church Year"

**April 3** – **Lent V** – The vineyard tenants parable issues a stern warning about using death as a solution like abortion or assisted suicide. Paul's words – "for his sake I have suffered the loss of all things" (Philippians 3:8) – acknowledge the difficulties surprise pregnancy and terminal diagnosis bring. But Isaiah prophesies the sweet assurance of God's salvation in these difficulties: "a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert" (Isaiah 43:19).

**April 10 – Palm Sunday/Passion of Our Lord** – Philippians 2 outlines how the humble love of our Lord Jesus involved Him in human nature and our life from embryo until His own flesh failed in crucifixion. Not only does this sanctify every member of our race whatever their circumstances, but it also rests the rights and responsibilities for deciding the manners of our lives and the timing of our deaths in His hands (Deuteronomy 32:39). Both now come as gifts for our good!

**April 17 – Resurrection of Our Lord** – Christ is risen, in the body! This makes every other human body precious from fertilization to forever (Isaiah 65:20). Death belongs to the old things and the former ways (Isaiah 65:17) from which our God and Father has set us free (1 Corinthians 15:26). The grave lies empty and has nothing to offer, not even by means of physician-assisted suicide or abortions. Neither we nor our neighbors need submit to it any longer!

**April 24** – **Easter II** – The patient gentleness of Jesus with Thomas extends joy to him and not judgment. In like manner the Savior's forgiveness embraces also hearts guilty and grieving because of aborting their own children or accelerating their parent's death. "Peace be with you," Jesus says to you who have participated in violence against life, "receive My absolution and My Holy Spirit." Come, praise Him who has made you precious alongside men and maidens, infants and aged (Psalm 148:12)!
