 ongoing reminder that we can continue this journey walking in a new direction

- During the special congregational meeting, someone on the call emailed and pledged a \$100K gift to the Legacy Fund AND gave a gift to cover the deficit of the operating budget!
- These 2 gifts to the Legacy Fund will be dedicated in worship on December 18
- John Jorde 100K gift in honor of son who died in 1982 at age 5 from cancer
- Lorainne Hart 100K gift in memory of her parents

- Pledges update
 - 1.13 million is pledge total
 - More than enough money has been received to pay for the outdoor project (75K), the mission tithe and additional funds towards 2023
- Mortgage payment and new loan terms from Thrivent
 - o \$300K mortgage payment made
- Buckthorn removal & retaining wall bid updates
 - o Buckthorn will start after hard freeze
 - o Waiting on retaining wall bid updates, Kienan to meet with contractor next week

Finances (20 Ministry update/Treasurer Role - Whitney min) Kienan and o Treasurer also sits on Exec Committee Whitney Kienan makes Whitney's job so much easier! Kudos to Kienan!
