From the Pastor...

"Confession" time. Like all parents I tend to think about parental issues with more attention as I am going through them myself. Thus, it won't surprise you to learn that, as Shelly and I have thought through the college application process with Zack over the last year, we have talked a lot about the importance of keeping young people in church. The statistics are scary. Between 40 and 50% of those who are active in church through their high school years will fall away during their young adult years. Perhaps a good percentage of those will return later in life for marriage and to have their kids baptized and taught the faith. But why should we be content with losing any of our young people, let alone up to a quarter. Jesus said it best, "what will it profit a man to gain the whole world but lose his soul." (Matt 16:26)

In our household this has been at the center of the college conversation. We found schools that offered the fields of study that Zack was interested in and then applied to them. However, from the beginning the ground rules were: In addition to getting accepted and being offered sufficient financial aid, there was also the necessity of finding a solid LCMS congregation or campus ministry nearby. We were not prepared to send Zack off into this next stage of his life without knowing that a faithful community of Lutherans was there to support him. And, truth be told, over the last year I have enjoyed many good conversations with pastors around the country. To a man, they have all expressed their appreciation for the calls, because all faithful pastors care about our young people.

But in addition to the college search, here are some things to consider as we raise our children to be useful citizens in this world all the while remaining citizens of God's Kingdom. For starters, we must recognize that the world is increasingly hostile to the Christian faith. There was a time when the morality of the culture around us overlapped nicely with Christianity, but those days are long gone, even here in Wisconsin. And, of course, morality is not the only thing under attack. Marriage and sexuality, gender and identity, and especially the centrality and exclusivity of


Christianity are all under assault.

We must be intentional about raising up our children to confess and to "own" the faith. Let Deuteronomy 6:4-7 guide your thinking and your actions. "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."

You can live out that command in many ways, including: doing devotions frequently, not just during Advent and Lent; actually praying with your kids about the things that concern them; reciting and discussing the Small Catechism as you drive around (thus, redeeming the time); reflecting together on the movies you watch or the TV news reports you hear; taking your job as a baptismal sponsor seriously; encouraging young people to volunteer around the church; encouraging them to research the topics that interest them and thus to defend the faith in their daily lives; and by discussing the sermon/service on the way home from church or over lunch/dinner.

Our children are "in" the world – there's no avoiding that; but they don't need to be "of" the world. Regardless of what our young people grow up to do, they are first and foremost baptized children of God. They are precious in His sight. I realize that many parents have difficulty articulating the faith, but you will get better at it the more you try. Too much is at

stake to not try!

other's company. Conversations vary from month to month, but always in a great atmosphere of Christian fellowship and fun...very informal!



The 2015-2017 biennium Mission Goal of the National LWML of \$2,000,000 was reached in the middle of March. This meant that all 19 Mission Grants were fully funded.

Thanks be to our gracious Lord and Savior for this blessing! As the mites are collected in each of the districts of the LWML, 25% of these mites are sent to the National LWML. This money is used to fund the National Mission Grants. Delegates at the National LWML Convention in Albuquerque, NM in June 22-25, 2017 will vote for the new Mission Grants for the 2017-2019 biennium.

Our Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod saw the need for reaching out to help congregations that have poor and disabled people living near their congregations in houses that are in need of much repair. The LCMS National Housing Support Corporation was founded and launched a "Helping Hand" initiative focused on helping these lowincome, disabled, and/or elderly residents through housing repair services.

The National LWML Mission Grant "Helping Hands of "Changeless," found on page 17 of the spring Initiative," gave \$100,000 to this LCMS organization. This will help LCMS congregations to provide a tool to care for their neighbors' bodily needs, while opening doors to provide the Word of God to unreached individuals and families.

Our EGL LWML is so appreciative to our congregation members who faithfully bring their filled mite boxes, donating this money for the Mission Grants of LWML. We thank you. You may put the filled

mite boxes on the counter of the Friendship Library, the church office, or in the large Mite Box near the LWML bulletin board. If you need a new mite box, please pick one up from the counter in the Friendship Library.






The evening group of LWML will meet Monday, May 1 in the Friendship Library at 7:00 p.m. to assemble hygiene kits for missions.

What is a "confessional" Lutheran? The word "confession" is used in a variety of ways, but when we speak of a "confessional" Lutheran we mean a Lutheran who declares to the world his faith and most deeply held belief and conviction, in harmony with the documents contained in the Book of Concord. You will catch the spirit of confessional Lutheranism in these, the last words written in the Book of Concord:

Therefore, it is our intent to give witness before God and all Christendom, among those who are alive today and those who will come after us, that the explanation here set forth regarding all the controversial articles of faith which we have addressed and explained-and no other explanation-is our teaching, faith, and confession. In it we shall appear before the judgment throne of Jesus Christ, by God's grace, with fearless hearts and thus give account of our faith, and we will neither secretly nor publicly speak or write anything contrary to it. Instead, on the strength of God's grace, we intend to abide by this confession (FC SD, XII, 40)

FACES OF STEWARDSHIP

It should come as no surprise that Dr. Justin and Bretta Speck are active and engaged members at EGL. They were raised in families that prioritized church studies, activities and relationships. Justin grew up in Rockford, IL, the son of the pastor of a mainstream Evangelical Baptist church. He became acquainted with Lutheranism by attending a Lutheran high school. Bretta grew up in Kenyon, MN on a dairy farm. Her family were fifth generation members of a Baptist church where her parents had met. It was a small church, made up of many family members, but even if they didn't share her DNA, all were considered family.

Bretta and Justin met at Bethel University in St. Paul, MN on the track team. After graduation and marriage they moved to South Korea to teach at NIC, Network of International Christian Schools, for four years. Justin taught high school chemistry and physics and Bretta taught Bible, middle school science, health and PE. They traveled to Hong Kong, Singapore and Indonesia and led mission trips. Bretta taught at a Christian school in Madagascar for a year. In South Korea the couple attended a Lutheran church, the same one Pastor Myers, retired EGL pastor, had attended, a discovery made when considering Elm Grove Lutheran as their church home after moving to Milwaukee. They had heard of our church while listening to White Horse Inn, a radio show broadcast in South Korea. Pastor Seinkbeil was a guest and his solid, confessional Lutheran thinking and practice was relatable to them.



Justin and Bretta joined EGL eight years ago. They have two children, Athanasius and Jael. Their son was born in South Korea; he was ten days old when they moved back to the U.S. and was baptized here. Both children attend our school.

When asked about the key influencers in their religious lives, Justin cites our pastors, the Men's Bible Study and his parents. He had a good friend in high school with whom he enjoyed talking theology who later became Athanasius' baptismal sponsor. Bretta credits her parents as model Christians. They lived their faith every day and emphasized the importance of service. Her grandmother prayed often and was focused on the scriptures.

Bretta and Justin were instilled with a call to serve. They value meeting other members, building relationships and supporting the community of believers. They appreciate that EGL is faithful to the Lutheran confessions, solid Bible teachings and deliberate about Law and Gospel. Justin feels it's important to have pastors preach scripture and not merely "mine" the Bible to support a sermon on life lessons.

The Speck's many activities in support of our church include Justin's role as an Elder for four years, an usher for six years, as a coach for the soccer team, plus support of Stammtisch and regular attendance at Men's Bible Study. Bretta is a young women's rep for LWML, has helped with Vacation Bible School for six years, taught Sunday School for five years, served on PTL for four years, as well as on Shepherding the Future and Call committees. She also attends the Women's Bible study, and enjoys Book Club and Ladies Night Out.

A Bible principle important to Justin is knowing that he is a poor miserable sinner who has been forgiven of so much and needs to be patient and forgiving of others. Bretta looks to the Book of Acts and Paul's missionary journey for the lesson to have faith even when life is hard.

Justin is a medical technologist at Wisconsin Diagnostics Laboratories, where he does medical testing in the microbiology department. Outside of work, he is a self-proclaimed computer nerd and enjoys building PCs and reading science books. Bretta recently began working toward her PhD in Behavioral Ecology at UWM, focusing on the mating calls of insects. Once completed, she would love to teach.






