From Your Pastor

Beloved Children of God,

Guilt. Heavy, oppressive, frightening, and discouraging guilt. You've wrestled with it. It was that thing you said, that secret you kept, that activity that keeps drawing you back like a moth to a flame. Maybe you can identify with these words from Psalm 130: **"Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord! O Lord, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my pleas for mercy! If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, O Lord, who could stand? But with you there is forgiveness, that you may be feared."**

The depth of your sin covered you, and you might have even wondered if you could ever feel forgiven. Of course, you know that Jesus forgives all your sins, but it's hard to feel forgiven when your insides are twisted and your heart is heavy.

What do you do then? How do you deal with these intense feelings of guilt? Thoughts of just "dealing with it" don't help, and you can be stopped in your tracks by the hurt of your sinfulness. So where do you turn to know and feel that the forgiveness of Jesus is for you?

One of the things that you can do is to speak with your pastors. There is a tradition of Lutheran pastors speaking privately with Christians and hearing them confess their sins and pronouncing God's forgiveness. However, this is more personalized than the confession in church because you hear yourself name your sins before your pastor and before God. There is a service for this in *Lutheran Service Book* on page 292. After hearing your confession, the pastor asks, "Do you believe that my forgiveness is God's forgiveness?" At first, this may sound like the pastor is arrogantly taking on authority that is not his. In John 20, Jesus appeared to His disciples on Easter night, breathed on them, the first pastors, and said, **"Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld."** Jesus created the ministry of pastors and gave that office the authority to forgive sins in His name. Then, the pastor places his hands on the head of the person who confesses his or her sin and pronounces God's forgiveness, just like Jesus commanded.


You might think that this sounds "too Catholic." This is a practice observed by the Roman Catholic Church.

However, it's also a practice that is referred to in Martin Luther's *Small Catechism*. In the section on confession, Luther encourages Christians to confess the sins that they know and feel in their hearts to their pastor. He even provides a format for confession that is very similar to the one used in the hymnal. This practice of individual confession and absolution (that is, forgiveness) was used by Luther himself, and has been used in the Lutheran Church since then. It is true that it has fallen into disuse in the 19th and 20th centuries, but this treasure is meant to comfort guilty and overwhelmed consciences; it is meant for you!

It is by feeling hands on your head, being called by name, and hearing the words of God's forgiveness that you are reminded that God's forgiveness, won on the cross and sealed by the empty tomb, is certainly for you! It is a reminder of Psalm 103:11-12: **"For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us."** While guilt might feel overwhelming, your Jesus has overcome your sin and your guilt. This gift awaits you. Come dear child of God, come.

FACES OF STEWARDSHIP



Carmen Nieting is one of Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church's many encouraging seniors. She was born on April 9, 1922, in the parsonage of St. John Lutheran Church, at Culbertson, Nebraska, during a confirmation service at which her father was officiating! She attended the parochial school at St. John and then went to study in Seward, Nebraska, at Concordia High School and Concordia College, finishing in 1944. She then married Robert Nieting and they both had teaching assignments "out East" in Long Island and New York. Their marriage lasted for 69 wonderful years before he went to be with the Lord in 2014.

In 1955 they came to Elm Grove Lutheran after a stop in Edina, Minnesota. Robert was called to be the teacher-principal, assistant organist, and occasional bus driver. Carmen taught split grades in the fellowship hall. She remembers having Andy Bartelt, the pastor's son, in 4th grade, and her own son Mark in 5th grade. Her musical talent included playing the organ for local churches, piano for the Sunday school, as well as teaching piano to many Elm Grove Lutheran students.

Christmas Eve services bring back many fond memories for Carmen and her children as each year two services were scheduled. The children, Mark (now a retired LCMS pastor), Lesley (retired graphic artist), and Alicia (currently an LCMS teacher at Our Redeemer in Wauwatosa) waited anxiously for their father the principal to come home so they could open presents. Living at 755 Terrace Drive made it a short walk home for Bob, but a long wait for the children!

Carmen now has seven grandchildren and five great grandchildren. She loves to read and notes in her hymnal the number of times each hymn is sung in church. [Rumor has it that Pastor Skovgaard wants that hymnal!] She enjoys playing piano and singing hymns as well as old classics. Her memory still lets her play Beethoven and Mozart, even with stiff fingers!

Two of Carmen's many favorite Bible passages are Matthew 6:33, "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." And John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that He gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

Over the years she has worked with the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML), taught Sunday school, sung in the choir, and reviewed international manuscripts for Bible studies. Having a heart for the Lord, Carmen has never counted her hours of service. They have been the joy of her Christian life. God bless you, Carmen Nieting!




BREAD & FISH

NEW TREE PLANTINGS PROPOSAL


Given the fact that the Elm Grove Lutheran campus has lost 12 mature trees over the last five years due to old age, disease, etc., a program of replacement has been proposed and approved by the Church Council. Because there is no planned funding for tree replacement, the Board of Trustees will actively seek memorials and special gift offerings to provide the necessary funding to plant replacement trees.

The trees will be purchased and planted with a warranty from a professional nursery. The donor has the



option of participating in the selection of the tree(s). The deciduous trees planted will be approximately three inches in diameter and stand 12 to 15 feet tall. The mature height will be 30 to 50 feet. Evergreen trees will be of comparable size and age with the approximate total cost of installation at \$750 per tree. As with all purchases of this nature, the cost will vary with the total expenditure at the time of purchase, so, the more items purchased at a given time, the lower per unit cost.









STANDING ON THE PROMISES OF GOD:




CHILDCARE – HELP NEEDED
