8th Grade: Chapter 11 NPA A pronoun list was sent home indicating when the quizzes are. Here are the dates for reference: Indefinites (20) 10-8 (Monday), Final quiz on all pronouns 10-10 (Wednesday). One common issue with language arts homework seems to be "rushing". Rushing to get it done, rushing to read the sentence, rushing to mark the word. Take your time and work carefully. Also, don't forget to do corrections. **Spelling:** Unit 8 has been assigned. Test 1 is on Monday, 10-8. The book work and test 2 are on Wednesday, 10-10. Please help your child remember to work on those spelling words for the week so that he/she is prepared for test 1 on Mondays. Volunteer to give them a practice test or two before Monday.

MATHEMATICS — MS. CORN

5th Grade Math: This week we continued to work on our Multiplication facts. We will continue to explore multiplication next week focusing on multiplication with decimals and within word problems.

6th Grade Math: Next week we finish chapter two exploring distributive property on Monday and I am planning a test on Thursday, October 11th.

7th Grade Math: Next week we will finish Chapter 2 on Monday with solving inequalities by using multiplication and division. We will be scheduled to have our Chapter 2 test on Thursday, October 11th.

7th Grade Pre-Algebra: We will be exploring equations, working with word problems, and looking at inequalities and their graphs. I am planning on giving their chapter 2 test on Wednesday, October 9th.

8th Grade Math: We will explore some word problems next week and begin solving one and two step inequalities next week. We will be able to complete Chapter 2 before the end of the first quarter. I am looking at scheduling the test around October 18th.

8th Algebra: We finished with Chapter 2 this week with a test. We will begin Chapter 3 next week. This Chapter focuses on solving one, two, and multi-step inequalities.

SCIENCE — MRS. WEYMIER

5th Grade: *Unit B Chapter 5 - Energy and Ecosystems* We are wrapping up the chapter by reviewing natural cycles next week. The test is scheduled for Thursday, 10-12. Any homework corrections are due by Thursday, 10-12.

6th Science: Chapter 1 - Cells, Reproduction and Heredity We have been working through section 3 of the chapter - "How do cells reproduce?". It covers both mitosis and meiosis, both of which are new science concepts to the sixth graders. The students took a mitosis quiz on Thursday, 10-4. Next week will focus on meiosis, and how mitosis/meiosis are similar and how they are different. Then, we move on to the last section of the chapter on heredity. Anyone know who Gregor Mendel was?

7th Grade: Chapter 1 - Matter We will continue to work with concepts involving measuring matter (bring a calculator to class). This week we reviewed calculating volume and density. Both of these concepts were covered in fifth grade. There is a new concept, specific gravity, that we will cover as well. Then, it is on to the last section of the chapter - "Particles of Matter". Make sure you review and study your notes every night. I am predicting a chapter vocabulary quiz on 10-15 and the chapter test on 10-17.

8th Grade: Chapter 1 - Cells The chapter test was Friday, 10-5. Next week, we start our new chapter - "Cell Processes And Energy".

SOCIAL STUDIES — MISS LINDHOLM

5th Grade Geography: We took our test over chapter 2. We will start chapter 3 which is on Human Geography.

6th Grade World History: We looked at the civilization of Sumer. We discussed some of the advancements in math and technology they came up with. We learned what cuneiform is and came up with pictures to show words.

7th Grade American History: We talked a lot about Christopher Columbus. We discussed why the Spanish were able to defeat the Aztec and the Inca. Our test will be on Tuesday, 10-9.
