LANGUAGE ARTS/SPELLING

5th Grade: Language Arts: We are learning about adverbs, writing persuasive essays, and reviewing past lessons. **Spelling:** We will begin Lesson 14 on December 10.

6th Grade: We will learned about linking verbs and transitive and intransitive verbs. **Spelling:** Unit 15 test 1 is on Monday, 12-10. The book work and test 2 are due on Thursday, 12-13.

7th Grade: We will finish Chapter 12 on Verbs, Adverbs, Prepositions, Conjunctions, and Interjections next week. The Unit 16 Spelling test will be on Monday and the worksheets/rewrites are due on Wednesday. Find our Spelling lists/schedule on the 7th grade page on www.eql.org.

8th Grade: Chapter 12 - VAPCI Our new grammar chapter covers verbs, adverbs, prepositions, conjunctions and interjections. We are working our way through the verbs right now. Start reviewing the preposition verses since you will need to learn them for memory. Oh - that's right- you did that for me in sixth grade. All you need to do is review them. **Spelling:** Unit 17 has been assigned. It is kind of a difficult topic - words commonly misspelled. Students need to spend some extra time with these words. Test 1 is on Monday, 12-10. The book work and test 2 are on Wednesday, 12-12. Please help your child remember to work on those spelling words for the week so that he/she is prepared for test 1 on Monday. Volunteer to give them a practice test or two before Monday.

LITERATURE — MRS. ELVERS

5th Grade: We are working on making conclusions and generalizations. We will start a new novel next week as we begin dialogue journals.

6th Grade: We will present final projects for **Bridge To Terabithia**, and will start our new novel as we begin dialogue iournals.

7th Grade: We finished reading two novels in small groups, **Pictures of Hollis Woods** and **The Monument**. We are starting a new novel next week.

8th Grade: Final presentation grades for **The Pearl** went home. We will review literature terms, read short stories, and start a dialogue journal next week.

MATHEMATICS — MS. CORN

5th Grade Math: We will finish chapter 3 exploring Division concepts next week with a test on Tuesday. The next chapter explores further into the concept of division.

6th Grade Math: We finished Chapter 4 with a test today. Next week we will begin chapter 5 that focuses on multiplying and dividing with fractions.

7th Grade Math: We finished Chapter 4 with a test today. Next week we will start Chapter 5 learning about ratios and proportions.

7th Grade Pre-Algebra: Next week we will continue working with fractions concepts, in particular solving equations with fractions.

8th Grade Math: Next week we will finish chapter 4 with a test on Monday. Then we will start Chapter 5 working with ratios and proportions.

8th Algebra: We finished Chapter 5 with a test today. Next week we will begin Chapter 6 exploring linear equations and their graphs.

SCIENCE — MRS. WEYMIER

Elm Grove Lutheran is having a Science Fair in March! Paperwork was sent home on Friday, November 30.

Get to the library to check out some science fair books for ideas.

5th Grade: *Unit B Chapter 6 - Ecosystems and Change* Chapter test is scheduled for Monday, 12-10. We will then begin a chapter on matter and its properties.

6th Science: Chapter 3 - Plants and Plant Growth Has your child told you about our seeds? They are germinating! We have been giving them water, oxygen and warmth (WOW) and now the baby plants have cracked out of the seed coat and are above the soil line! Students took a quiz on the parts of a leaf today (12-8). Next week, we move into photosynthesis and respiration.

7th Grade: Chapter 3 - The Periodic Table New chapter started on Friday (12-8). Students will be learning the names and symbols for the first 40 elements on the periodic table. They were given a schedule of quiz dates today. The quiz dates are as follows: Elements 1-10 Tuesday 12/11; Elements 11-20 Thursday 12/13; Elements 1-20 Friday 12/14; Elements 21-30 Monday 12/17; Elements 31-40 Tuesday 12/18; Elements 21-40 Wednesday 12/19; Elements 1-40 (again) Friday 1/4/19. Start studying early.

8th Grade: Chapter 15 - Bones, Muscles and Skin We finish up with bones and move on to the muscles next week. Matching quiz over the muscle man on Tuesday, 12-11. Reading pages from the textbook have been assigned for the bone and muscle sections. Have you read them? *Notice, there are more quizzes than homework assignments, so regular studying outside of class becomes your homework. Just a little taste of what high school will be like.

SOCIAL STUDIES — MISS LINDHOLM

5th Grade Geography: We learned how Christmas is celebrated in Italy, England, Sweden, and Spain. Our last country we will learn about is Australia. Students also chose a partner and a country and they will research how that country celebrates Christmas and share it with the class.

6th Grade World History: We finished up our chapter on the Israelites. Our new chapter in on Greece.

7th Grade American History: We finished up our chapter on life in the colonies. We started our new chapter on the spirit of independence.
