MATHEMATICS — MS. CORN

5th Grade Math: Next week we will begin Chapter 4 which explores further into the concept of division.

6th Science: Chapter 3 - Plants and Plant Growth It looks like we'll be able to finish this chapter with a test on Friday, December 21. We are doing a lab next week on photosynthesis and respiration.

7th Grade: Chapter 3 - The Periodic Table New chapter started on Friday (12-8). Students will be learning the names and symbols for the first 40 elements on the periodic table. The quiz dates are as follows: Elements 21-30 Monday 12/17; Elements 31-40 Tuesday 12/18; Elements 21-40 Wednesday 12/19; Elements 1-40 Thursday 12/20; Elements 1-40 (again) Friday 1/4/19. Lots of new vocabulary this past week. Make sure you review them often.

8th Grade: Chapter 15 - Bones, Muscles and Skin We have finished this chapter and will be taking the test on Tuesday, December 18. Our next chapter covers the nutrition and the digestive system.


5th Grade: We were planning for a printing project. Sketch #14 drawn in the folder is due on Monday, Dec. 17.
