From Your Pastor

Yes, in the calendar of Commemorations in the front of the Lutheran Service Book, our hymnal, St. Valentine is listed on February 14. Thus, February 14 is a recognized day in the Church calendar! But to fully appreciate St. Valentine's Day and celebrate it appropriately, it's important to know the 'rest of the story.'

Valentine was a martyr; that means he was a Christian who died because of his witness for Jesus Christ. In fact, the word "martyr" comes from the Greek language, meaning to bear witness. Martyrs, thus, are Christians who continue to bear witness right up until the point of death. Valentine refused to renounce his faith in our Lord and thus was executed.

He was initially a physician and priest living in Rome during the reign of Roman Emperor Claudius. During an age when many Christians were being martyred, Valentine became one of the noted martyrs of the third century. The commemoration of his death, which occurred in A.D.270, became a part of the calendar of remembrance in the Early Church of the West. Tradition suggests that on the day of his execution for his Christian faith, Valentine left a note of encouragement for a child of his jailer written on an irregularly shaped piece of paper. This greeting became a pattern for millions of written expressions of love and caring that now are the highlight of Valentine's Day in many nations.

On the Commemorations page of LSB you will find this quote from the Augsburg Confession Article 21: "Our churches teach that the remembrance of the saints is to be commended in order that we may imitate their faith and good works according to our calling." If we are a physician or other medical person, we can look to Valentine (or Luke) for encouragement. If we are a government official, we can look to King David or Daniel as a government adviser, etc.

That same page goes on to explain that there is "great benefit in remembering the saints whom God has given to His Church. The Apology of the Augsburg Confession (Article 21) gives three reasons for such honor. First, we thank God for giving faithful servants to His Church. [Such faithful servants are instruments of God used preserve the Church from generation to generation.] Second, through such remembrance our faith is strengthened as we see the mercy that God extended to His saints of old. [If God had mercy on them, He can and has promised to have mercy on us, too.] Third, these saints are examples by which we may imi-

tate both their faith and their holy living according to our calling in life." [God has called His faithful from many different walks of life; we are not the first generation of Christians. Thus, we should look to the past as we follow Christ in our day and age.]


"Their [those faithful who have gone before us] defense of the fundamental beliefs of the Christian faith and/or their virtuous living have caused these individuals to stand out over time as persons worthy of recognition. In every case, the purpose of our remembrance is NOT that we honor these saints for their own sake, but as examples of those in whom the saving work of Jesus Christ has been made manifest to the glory of His holy name and to the praise of His grace and mercy."


Note that the Scriptures and our Confessions do not tell us to pray to the saints, but to thank God for them and to be encouraged by their examples. Even as you give thanks to God for parents, grandparents, pastors, and teachers whom you knew and who taught you the faith, you can also thank God for faithful Christians from centuries past. Have a happy St. Valentine's Day!



Almighty and everlasting God, You kindled the flame of Your love in the heart of Your holy martyr St. Valentine, allowing him to keep the faith until the very end. Grant to us, Your humble servants, a similar faith and the power of love, that we who rejoice in Christ's triumph over death and the grave may embody His love in our lives in service to You and those we love; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. 

"Shh! Peace. Be Still." is found on pages 18-19 in the winter issue of *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly*. In our own lives, we can experience "storms" of physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual stress. At these times we look to Jesus for help and guidance for peace in our lives. We will be studying several Bible verses to reinforce the theme. "Be still and know that I am God." Psalm 46:10a

The mission grant goal for the National LWML was set at \$2,075,000 for the 2017-2019 biennium. Of the 22 mission grants, ten mission grants have been fully funded, and twelve have been partially funded. We pray that by the 2019 national convention in June 2019, all of the mission grants will be funded. One of the National LWML Mission Grants is "Lutheran World Relief Quilt and Kit Shipping Fund" for \$80,000, which has been partially funded. Lutheran World Relief collects handmade quilts from Lutheran Churches throughout our country to send to needy people throughout the



world. This mission grant will go toward the shipping of 35,500 handmade quilts.

The giving of mites goes to support mission grants for the South Wisconsin District LWML at 75% and the National LWML at 25%. Thank you for your support when you donate your mites by filling up your mite boxes and returning them to our church – either in the big Mite Box at the LWML bulletin board in the lower lobby or by dropping the mite boxes off at the counter in the Fellowship Library.

An upcoming event sponsored by our South Wisconsin District LWML is the Leader Development Workshop on Saturday, March 23, 2019 at Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church in Waukesha, WI. The purpose of this workshop is to give LWML women the chance to grow in their faith and service to the Lord. Registration for the workshop begins at 8:30 a.m. with the program beginning at 9:00 a.m.





FOCUS ON FACULTY




