LANGUAGE ARTS/SPELLING

5th Grade: We are reviewing punctuation, abbreviations, and will work on public speaking. We are in lesson 20 for spelling. Practice is due on Thursday and the test will be on Friday.

We are taking a slight break from a grammar chapter in order to move more quickly through our next science chapter. We'll be back to grammar (complements) in a few weeks. **Spelling**: Unit 26 has been assigned. Test 1 is on Monday, 2-11. Test 2 and the bookwork are due on Wednesday, 2-13. Please help your child remember to work on those spelling words for the week so that he/she is prepared for test 1. Volunteer to give them a practice test or two before Monday.

LITERATURE — MRS. ELVERS

5th Grade: We are working in our Journeys curriculum.

6th Grade: We are reading the novel Old Yeller.

7th Grade: We are reading the novel **Wringer.**

8th Grade: We are finishing the novel Don't Give Up; Don't Give In.

MATHEMATICS — MS. CORN

5th Grade Math: We began our chapter on Data Collection and reporting by exploring various types of graphs this week. Next week we will do some things using Google Sheets, which is the google form of Excel, to learn how to enter date and generate various types of graphs. Later in the week we will learn about mean, median, and mode.

6th Grade Math: We finished with Chapter 6 this week and will have the review and test next week. That will be included on their midterm report cards. We will then move into a chapter focusing on data and graphs.

7th Grade Math: We finish with Chapter 6 this week but we will finish our test on Monday. The next chapter explores geometry concepts.

7th Grade Pre-Algebra: We started Chapter 7 this week. This chapter explores solving various equations and inequalities.

8th Grade Math: We finish with Chapter 6 this week but we will finish our test on Monday. The next chapter explores geometry concepts.

8th Algebra: We will finish Chapter 7 next week with a test on Monday and possible Tuesday if the students need to finish. This deals with solving systems of equations and inequalities. This test will be on mid-quarter grades. We will then move into Chapter 8 exploring exponents and exponential functions.

SCIENCE — MRS. WEYMIER

Elm Grove Lutheran is having a Science Fair in March! A new packet of paperwork was handed out and discussed in class on Thursday, February 7. Students should plan ahead and use this weekend and Monday, February 18 to get a lot done on their projects.

Science Fair display boards are available for purchase from Mrs. Weymier. The cost is \$2.50 per board.

5th Grade: Unit E Chapter 1 - Properties of Matter We are reaching the end of this chapter. The topics of mixtures, solutions, chemical changes and the Law of Conservation of Matter will wrap up the material. Students got the chapter vocabulary list so that they can start studying. Possible test date is Tuesday, February 19.

6th Science: Unit B - Types of Plants We are reaching the end of this chapter. Make sure you review the vocabulary nightly. Next week we will cover monocots, dicots, grafting and runners. I am scheduling the test for Friday, February 15.

7th Grade: Chapter 9 - Motion This new chapter covers motion, speed, velocity, and acceleration. Calculators are recommended for the formula work. There is an experiment in this chapter that uses skateboards. Please have your child bring in a skateboard from home if he/she has one. Extra credit will be given for those that come to school. We are running the experiment on Wednesday, February 15. Right now, only one skateboard has been brought in. We need one more in order to run the lab. Make sure you have a straightedge and sharpened pencil for class as we will be doing some graphing.

8th Grade: Chapter 16 - Nutrition and the Digestive System Test is scheduled for Monday, February 11. If you are still planning on bringing in your extra credit nutrition food, the last day for that is Monday, February 11. Next chapter covers the circulatory system. We will be using some language arts class periods the next few weeks so we can move more quickly through this chapter. Be prepared for more quizzes than usual.

SOCIAL STUDIES — MISS LINDHOLM

5th Grade Geography: We have been talking about the Spanish arriving in South America. We also learned how they gained their independence.
