2019-2020 REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN Registration is open on Fast Direct. Please log into your family account to register for next school year. It is a simple one click per child. Please also be mindful of the annual non refundable registration fee (per student) for next school year. They are as follows:

- Between April 13, 2019 and May 31, 2019 - \$150.00 per student
- After June 1, 2019 - \$250.00 per student
- Anytime for new families - \$75.00 per student

We request registration fees be paid to EGL by check unless you request to have your registration fee billed to you via TADS. If you would like you to be billed through TADS please email your request to Amy Stroh.

If you are a family that is participating in the Private School Choice Program these above amounts do not apply to you. However, we do ask that you please re register in Fast Direct for next school year as well as through the Private School Choice Application at <https://apps4.dpi.wi.gov/ChoiceParent/> and provide EGL with the required verification documents.

COMPUTER

LANGUAGE ARTS/SPELLING

5th Grade: Language Arts: We are working in our Writing Handbook completing a variety of small essays. 6th Grade: We will finish learning about clauses. **Spelling:** Unit 34 has been assigned. Test 1 is Monday, May 20. Test 2 and the bookwork are due on Thursday, 5-23.

8th Grade: Diagramming Sentences: We are wrapping up language arts with a quick unit on sentence diagramming. It combines knowing your parts of speech with some art skills. Most students are pretty successful at diagramming, but it is important to follow the rules. **Spelling:** We finished with the last regular unit and are not going to go back to do the review units. I will be using the spelling periods for Family Life Education class periods.

MATHEMATICS — MS. CORN

6th Grade Math: Next week we will then move into learning about integers. We will have one more test before the end of the year, I will plan it for the last week of school.

I will continue to go through some lessons in the remainder of the school year that I feel is important for the students to have before high school geometry.

SCIENCE — MRS. WEYMIER

5th Grade: Unit E Chapter 4 - Sound and Light We started exploring the sound portion of the chapter. Plan for a test over waves and sound on Wednesday, May 29.

6th Science: The Animal Kingdom - Vertebrates There are five categories of animals in this new chapter - fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds, and mammals. We have gone through all five vertebrate groups. The test over vertebrates will be on Friday, May 24.

7th Grade: Chapter 12 - Work and Machines We have been working with two formulas this past week, $W=Fd$ and $P=W/t$. Next week we are doing a lab. Students will calculate how much power they use in walking up a flight of stairs and then running up a flight of stairs. We will take a final quiz on Wednesday, May 29.

8th Grade: Chapter 17 - Nervous System There will be a final quiz/test on Thursday, May 30.
