From Your Pastor

In September of last year Elm Grove Evangelical Lutheran Church agreed at its regularly scheduled Voters Assembly to support Dr. Sam Lee as he entered into the Specific Ministry Pastor [SMP] program, which is an alternate route to ordination course of study. Since that official vote, Sam has passed all of his required entrance exams on Old and New Testament content and Christian doctrine. Plus, he has received approval from District President John Wille. He has applied to the Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne. Elm Grove Lutheran Church has also applied to be in the vicarage program; thus, all the pieces are in place. Pending formal acceptance, Dr. Lee and EGL will officially begin his



two-year vicarage this fall. Not wanting to waste any time as he waits to start, Sam has even been studying New Testament Koine Greek with retired Pastor Myers for the last couple of months.

Sam attended the Spring Pastors' Conference, May 13-15 in LaCrosse, with Pastors Skovgaard and Peters.

It's natural to ask what does this mean for us as a congregation? At the most basic level, it means that EGL has the great privilege of training a man to be a future pastor. While most of his classwork will take place online, there will be occasions to take short courses on the Fort Wayne campus. However, my ambition for Dr. Lee is to give him as wide a vicarage experience as possible to prepare him for the future planting of a Chinese-language Lutheran Church. On vicarage, our hope is to expose him as much as possible to all aspects of parish life. He will of course continue to lead the Saturday night Chinese fellowship, but he will not start out planting a mission church until after his vicarage. First, we want him to learn all the applicable ropes, as any vicar would.


Because of our size, EGL is well-suited to give Sam a variety of experiences related to Pastoral Ministry. He will learn to lead worship, making use of the Lutheran Service Book. Once he has had the appropriate classes he will have opportunities to preach. There are adult

Bible studies to lead during the weekdays and on Sundays. Because of our school and experienced teaching staff, he will have exposure to various classrooms to learn how to address different age groups of children. He can also expect to attend various Board meetings and Church Council to better understand the importance of good administration. In all of this we assume regular exposure to hospital visits, homebound visits, and evangelism calls.


It's also important to remember that the SMP program is a joint effort on behalf of the congregation, the seminary, the South Wisconsin District, and Dr. Lee. As the sponsoring entity, we/EGL agree to pray for him and his family and to support him spiritually and emotionally; to develop with the District a financial plan in which the costs of education and the support of the student are met in a realistic way; and to require him to complete the study program as administered by the seminary.

It is certainly fun and rewarding to reflect back on how we arrived at where we are today. Sam, Rose, and Angela came to us nearly ten years ago in the summer of 2009. The Lees were members at Spring Creek Church in Pewaukee at the time when they stumbled upon the Saturday night Chinese fellowship meeting at EGL, led then by the now deceased Pastor Jerry Lange. After studying Luther's Small Catechism with me, Sam was confirmed on September 27, 2009. He quickly became a natural leader within the Chinese fellowship, and when Pastor Lange died four years ago, Sam stepped into his place, guiding the group and leading their Bible studies.

About three years ago the idea of attending seminary first surfaced; however, with his daughter Angela halfway through high school at the time and the growing dependence of the Chinese fellowship on Sam, moving away to a residential seminary experience was not realistic. A year and a half ago, however, the SMP program came into focus, and the rest is history. I remain grateful to EGL for seeing the wisdom and opportunity to form Dr. Sam Lee into a formidable theologian and missionary pastor for the LCMS. We can all be thankful that God is allowing us to participate with Him in extending the Gospel outreach of the Church.



You can be quite creative in decorating the trees. All the materials will be supplied. Bring a glue gun to the meeting. We invite all women of our congregation to come and help with this worthwhile mission project.

Mobile, Alabama is the site of the 38th Biennial LWML National Convention on June 20-23, 2019. The theme for this convention is **In Praise of the Lord!** "Sing to the Lord, all the earth! Tell of His salvation from day to day. Declare His glory among the nations! 1 Chronicles 16:23-24b. Jean Kruse and Sherri Bond will be attending this convention.

In last month's *Seasons*, Mission Grant #5 – **Shelter My Sheep – Free at Last** for \$20,000 was explained.

This is a prison ministry that keeps in touch with ex-inmates to help nourish them in their faith. About 80% of this money has been collected through the contributions of mites. Since last month, I have learned more about this special ministry, which I would like to share with you. Pastor Afam Ikanih, is the LCMS Chaplain at the Milwaukee County House of Corrections in Franklin, WI, which houses about 1,300 men and 200 women. The Lord has blessed this ministry. Since 2008, Pastor Ikanih has baptized over 2,500 men and women. In addition to Chapel, Bible classes, and individual counseling, Pastor Ikanih gives free haircuts on Tuesdays for about 40-45 inmates who refuse to attend Chapel and Bible class. **Haircuts for Jesus** gives Pastor Ikanih an opportunity to tell the Good News of Jesus Christ, while they are getting their haircuts. After being released from prison, it is important to nourish these men and women spiritually. Our inner city Lutheran churches are helping with this ministry. Mis-



sion of Christ Lutheran Church, where Pastor Ikanih is pastor has an exceptional program to help them to feel "free at last," especially knowing that they are free at last and forgiven by our Lord

Jesus Christ. Another interesting note is that Pastor Ikanih is the son of the Rev. Dr. Christian Ihanih, pastor of Bethany Lutheran Church in Milwaukee.

Our LWML is always appreciative of the mites that you contribute. Thank you! It is awesome to see how the mites add up to fund our Mission Grants. To God be the glory!



VBS is for all children, ages 3(potty trained)-completed 5th grade. Those who are older are encouraged to volunteer as helpers.


There is no fee for VBS, however if you would like to donate, we would gladly use it to offset any costs.




