



“When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy. And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshipped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh.” [Matthew 2:10-11]

From the Pastor...

You've come to expect your pastors to say that it's important to be in church, to attend services regularly, to participate in events, and even to volunteer in many and various ways. You might even hear your pastor quote a Bible passage like following from Hebrews 10:25 as he urges you to keep church as a priority: "Let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

While you expect your pastor to say that, secular sources also highlight several benefits associated with regular worship attendance. According to research conducted by Dr Tyler VanderWeele, professor of epidemiology at Harvard, and summarized in an October 28, 2016 USA newspaper column, there was a 20-30% reduction in mortality rates over a 15-year period for those who attended church once a week. It seems that attending religious services brings about all around better physical and mental health, with attendant lower rates of depression and a greater sense of purpose in life.

According to the professor, church attendance also increases one's likelihood of having a stable marriage, an elevated sense of meaning in life, and a greater social network. It makes good logical sense, too. After all, where else but in church do you find a community with a shared moral and spiritual vision, a sense of accountability, and where one of the important goals of the group is to love and care for one another?

The results of VanderWeele's study have been replicated in enough other studies and population groups to be considered reliable. And to think that this elixir is free and within easy reach of most Americans! The draw to attend church for many may be beautiful music, meaningful liturgy, forgiveness, assurance of salvation, or a desire to serve God and others, but good health tags along unexpectedly.


Unfortunately, running parallel with this good news is a growing trend in our society to choose no religion at all, a category of people the pollsters call "The Nones." The Nones have no formal affiliation with organized religion and think of church as quaint and outdated. They may talk of being "spiritual" but usually that's just an excuse to stay home on Sunday morning. There's something about participating in a shared religious experience that matters. The combination of God's Word rightly divided between Law and Gospel, the development of relationships, and opportunities to serve – week after week – gradually alters behavior, creates meaning, alleviates loneliness, and shapes a person in ways too numerous to document.

So, as we begin 2017 in the year of our Lord's reign, let's heed the admonition of God's Word and be an active member at Elm Grove Lutheran Church. Not only is obedience to God's command always the right thing to do, but you may reap benefits you did not see coming.









REFORMATION 2017 It's *Still* All About **Jesus**

So what is it to be a Lutheran?

[2017 marks the 500th Anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation. In celebration of this event, each month there will be an article highlighting some of the history and teaching of the Reformation.]

Being a Lutheran is being a person who believes the truths of God's Word, the Holy Bible, as they are correctly explained and taught in the Book of Concord. To do so is to confess the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Genuine Lutherans, confessional Lutherans, dare to insist that

"All doctrines should conform to the standards [the Lutheran Confessions] set forth above. Whatever is contrary to them should be rejected and condemned as opposed to the unanimous declaration of our faith" (FC Ep. RN, 6).

Such a statement may strike some as boastful. But it is not; rather, it is an expression of the Spirit-led confidence that moves us to speak of our faith before the world.

To be a confessional Lutheran is to be one who honors the Word of God. That word makes it clear that it is God's desire for His church to be in agreement about doctrine, and to be of one mind, living at peace with one another (1 Cor. 1:10; 2 Cor. 13:11). It is for that reason that we so treasure the precious confession of Christian truth that we have in the Book of Concord. For Confessional Lutherans, there is no other collection of documents, or statements or books that so clearly, accurately and comfortingly presents the teachings of God's Word and reveals the Biblical Gospel as does our Book of Concord.

Hand-in-hand with our commitment to pure teaching and confession of the faith, is, and always must be, our equally strong commitment to reaching out boldly with the Gospel and speaking God's truth to the world. That is what "confession" of the faith is all about, in the final analysis. Indeed, "It is written: I believed; therefore I have spoken.' With that same spirit of faith we also believe and therefore speak" (2 Cor. 4:13). This is what it means to be a Lutheran.


