A NOTE FROM PASTOR DAVID MCCARTY

Dear Friends in Christ,

With such a magnificent view before my eyes I cannot but thank Almighty God for all he provides for you and me as his creation.

Elder's Letter


November Blessings from the Board of Elders!

I would like to invite you to a new Bible study that we will be starting on November 7 during our regular Wednesday morning Bible Study. It is called "<u>Growing Up in God</u>", written by Vikki Kestell. I will be leading this particular Bible study, but I will be submitting each lesson to Pastor before presenting it to you. It is important for you to know that it is not my intent to bypass Pastor McCarty in any way, I have submitted this Bible study to his authority and he has agreed to let me lead this Bible study.

Growing Up in God is a six-part study on Christian spiritual maturity. The study is intended to promote spiritual maturity and address issues that may be impeding personal growth. The six parts are each presented as a chapter and each chapter may have several lessons. We will take one lesson each week; therefore it won't necessarily be a six week Bible study. I have personally gone through the first few chapters of "Growing Up in God" and can truthfully say that I believe it is time very well spent. If you are anything like me you long to be a spiritually mature Christian, and know that no matter what my physical age may be, my spiritual maturity is no where near where I want it to be. God, as the ultimate parent, our Father, wants us to grow into maturity even more than we do! I have heard the argument, "Well, God loves me the way I am." To which I reply, "Well, of course He does, but He doesn't want to leave you that way!" What parent doesn't want to see their five year old grow into maturity and take on the joys that come with being an adult? God is not different in that respect. Hebrews 5:12-14, amplified version, says, "For though by this time you ought to be teachers [because of the time you have had to learn these truths], you actually need someone to teach you again the elementary principles of God's Word [from the beginning], and you have come to be continually in need of milk, not solid food! Anyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is not acquainted with the teaching about righteousness. But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil." That's where I want to be, how 'bout you?



INTRODUCTION:

I have a real zeal for the Word of God. I recently found a quote from Martin Luther that really spoke to my heart. He said, "The Bible is alive. It speaks to me; It has feet, it runs after me; It has hands, it lays hold of me." For this reason, I asked Pastor if I could include a Bible study in the newsletter so that those of you who wanted to could take advantage of it. It's really pretty simple, you look up each scripture passage and read it carefully and thoughtfully, then answer the three questions at the end of each section. There is a prayer that follows the questions for each day, which I hope you will pray with your whole heart. It is my sincere belief that "knowledge" of the Word of God is not enough to reach that soul satisfying depth of relationship with God that, it we have any degree of spiritual integrity, we all want.

We all have knowledge of Abraham Lincoln, but none of us actually KNEW him. It's the same with God's Word. We can have boatloads of knowledge about God's Word without actually "knowing" it. "Experience is the best teacher," is an old adage that I'm sure we're all familiar with. This is especially true of the Bible. We can actually experience the Word of God, having it reach into the depths of us and touching us in a way that is life changing. We can agree wholeheartedly with Martin Luther. The Bible can be alive to us. It can speak to us. It does have feet and can run after us, it can have hands and lay hold of us. It is God's primary way of speaking to us, His people.

All the while I was growing up here at Emmanuel I heard one prayer repeated over and over again in the liturgy. "Blessed Lord, who caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: Grant us so to hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which You have given us in our Savior Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen." So often I find that I read, I even mark up my Bible, I learn the scripture, could recite it by heart if you ask me, but where I come up short is in the inwardly digesting part. What do you think it means when we pray to inwardly digest God's Word?

When I taught at St. John's in Waltz, Michigan, I was good friends with one of the other teachers there. Quite often he and his wife would ask me to have dinner with them. They had a big old farmhouse style table in their kitchen. It had a drawer in it along the side, tucked under the top. My friend would often tell me that when she went to clean the table she would open this drawer and find all kinds of food tucked in it that their son hadn't wanted to eat. When I wrote the words from the liturgy above I was reminded of this drawer. Jr. had definitely seen the food, he recognized what it was, so we can say that he knew the food, he had learned about it enough to know that he didn't like it. But if it ended up in the drawer of the table, did he inwardly digest it? Obviously not, therefore any nutritional value that the food had was wasted. It certainly didn't bring any growth to the drawer in the table!

We can rush through our Bible study time, obediently reading the Word, we can mark it and learn it, but unless we are intentional, we will not inwardly digest it. The whole point of eating is to nourish our bodies. If we don't inwardly digest what we eat then we will suffer from malnutrition. Malnutrition has so many negative effects on our bodies. This is equally true with spiritual nutrition. If we do not inwardly digest our spiritual food there is only one outcome...spiritual malnutrition.

I'm going to end the introduction to this Bible study with some verses from the book of James. "But be doers of the Word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the Word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. But he who looks into the

perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the Word, this one will be blessed in what he does."

Note what scripture says we are doing if we are merely hearers of the Word. It says we are ourselves! What is the promise that we are given if we are not merely hearers of the Word, but actual doers of iţŝ Would you like this promise to be true of you? ______ I left a short line for your

You may find it helpful to keep a notebook at hand to record your answers in. Because this is the newsletter, we are trying to be good stewards of paper so I won't be adding lines during the actual Bible study for you to record your answers, but please don't let that stop you from completing the answers! Each day you will read the scripture verse and then answer these same 3 questions for each one.

• How can I summarize this passage in 2 or 3 sentences?

answer because, really, this seems like a no brainer. The End

- What does this passage teach me about living intentionally?
- What is the Lord specifically leading me to do in response to this passage?

Then after finishing the lesson for each day, pray and ask the Holy Spirit to help you walk in obedience to this passage. You may want to record anything that you feel He is saying to you in response to your prayer in your notebook.

Week Two

Day 1: Proverbs 16:1-9 Day 2: Proverbs 16:17-22, 25 Day 3: Philippians 1:19-31 Day 4: Philippians 2:3-13 Day 5: Philippians 3:12-17

Week Four

Day 1: 1Thessalonians 4:1-12 Day 2: 2 Thessalonians 3:6-15 Day 3: Hebrews 12:1-3, 12-17 Day 4: 1 Timothy 6:11-21 Day 5: 1 Corinthians 15:50-58

I hope you are able to work through this Bible study each day and that it feeds you spiritually. In Isaiah 55:11 God says, "My Word which goes forth from My mouth; it will not return to Me void, without accomplishing what I desire, and without succeeding in the matter for which I sent it." I would encourage you to expect to see and feel God working in you as you faithfully feed on His Word. Remember, He says His Word will accomplish what He desires, and we can be sure that just as any good parent, God, our Father, desires to see His children growing up in Him. Welcome to the feast!


