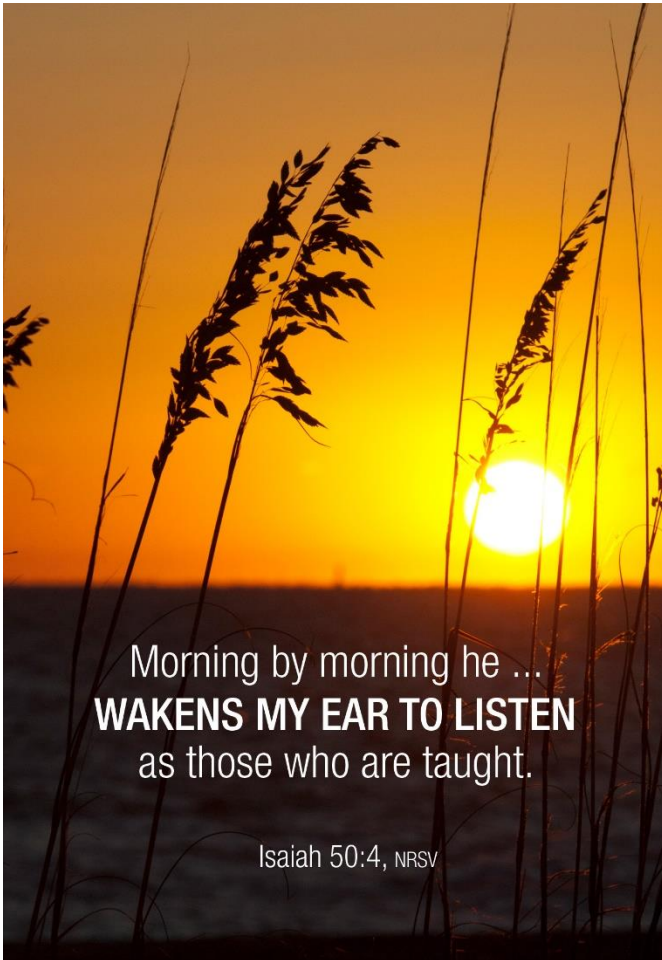

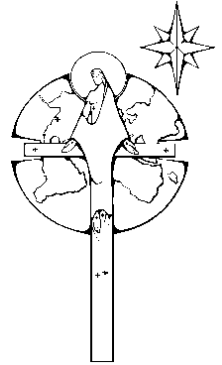

Epiphany Lutheran Church – Connecting People to Christ and One Another! Welcome, we are happy to have you here!

- We welcome you to worship, including the Lord's Supper. The following is a statement by one who receives Holy Communion at Epiphany: *"I have been baptized in the Name of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. I confess and repent of my sin. I believe that Jesus Christ is my Savior and the Lord of my life. I believe that Christ's body and blood are truly present in, with and under the bread and the wine of Holy Communion. I believe that in this Sacrament God gives me forgiveness of sins, eternal life and salvation."* Children and adults not receiving the Sacrament are invited to come forward for a blessing.
- We encourage families to worship with their children. There are blue binders with paper and crayons on the bookcase at the back of the Sanctuary for use during the service.
- Our Guests are invited to complete a worship card (found in the pew pocket), including prayer requests. Members are asked to use the worship card for prayer requests and updating contact information. Cards will be gathered by the ushers after the Gospel reading. Due to privacy concerns, we ask that if possible, permission be granted by the person for whom a prayer is requested. Thank you.

- We use the Lutheran Service Book for Liturgy and Hymns during the service - referenced as "LSB." Unless otherwise noted lyrics are projected on the screen.
