

Epiphany Lutheran Church – Connecting People to Christ and One Another! Welcome, we are happy to have you here!

- Welcome to worship! We are glad you are here. If we can do anything to serve you, please speak with an usher, deacon, or Pastor Mueller.
- Today's service will include Holy Communion. Those who communion share the confession of this congregation and the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. The following is what we confess together: "I have been baptized in the name of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. I confess and repent of my sin. I believe that Jesus Christ is my Savior and my Lord. I believe that Christ's body and blood are truly present in, with, and under the bread and the wine of Holy Communion. I believe that in this Sacrament God gives me the forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and salvation." Children and adults not receiving the Sacrament are invited to come forward for a blessing. If you are still learning about our confession, or if you hold a different confession, Pastor Mueller looks forward to speaking with you further about the blessings of the Lord's Supper.
- We encourage families to worship with their children. There are blue binders with paper and crayons on the bookcase at the back of the Sanctuary for use during the service.
- Our Guests are invited to complete a worship card (found in the pew pocket), including prayer requests. Members are asked to use the worship card for prayer requests and updating contact information.
 Cards will be gathered by the ushers after the Gospel reading. Due to privacy concerns, we ask that, if possible, permission be granted by the person for whom a prayer is requested. Thank you.

- We use the Lutheran Service Book for Liturgy and Hymns during the service - referenced as "LSB." Unless otherwise noted lyrics are projected on the screen.

As We Gather: Hosanna!

"Hosanna!" the crowd cries to Jesus, as He enters Jerusalem on a donkey's back on Palm Sunday. Hosanna means "save us now!", and they shout this to Jesus, whose name means "God saves." Today, we gather in worship of the one who saves. Hosanna!

- P On this Palm Sunday of our Lord, we join the crowds in calling our "hosannas" to the Son of David, our King. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!
- Mosanna to the Son of David!

Holy Gospel - John 12:12-19

Jesus enters Jerusalem on a donkey's back.

- The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out,
- "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!"
- P And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written,
- "Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!"

- P His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. So, the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."
- **P** This is the gospel of the Lord.
- **G** Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!
- Let us pray. Merciful God, as the people of Jerusalem gathered with hosannas to greet Your Son,
- in the same way, open our lips to cry our hosannas to the King who comes to save us;
- through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
- **G** Amen. Hosanna to the King!

Confession and Absolution

P As we call out our "hosannas" to Jesus our King, we confess our need for God's salvation.

Silent confession.

- P Almighty God,
- We confess before you and our brothers and sisters that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned, Lord God. We have not done what is right. We have wronged our neighbors. We have fallen short of your glory. In the name of our King, we cry: Hosanna! Save us, Lord, according to your steadfast mercy. Amen.
- P Each of us has fallen short of the glory of God. But God in His mercy sent the one who answers our cries of "hosanna." He has

come to save you: riding on a donkey's back to be your Savior from sin, even upon a cross. For His sake, your "hosannas" have been answered with grace. Hear the words of absolution in His name and for His sake: In the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

- Amen.
- P Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord.
- Hosanna in the highest!

- P O Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, in giving us Your body and blood to eat and to drink, You lead us to remember and confess Your holy cross and passion, Your blessed death, Your rest in the tomb, Your resurrection from the dead, Your ascension into heaven, and Your coming for the final judgment. So remember us in Your kingdom and teach us to pray:

- In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My
 → blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."
