#### Dear Friends in Christ:

June 26–28, 2025, I attended the English District Convention at Concordia University, Ann Arbor, Michigan. Also representing Eternal Life at the convention were Andrew G., our Lay Delegate; Pastor Resner, as an Advisory Delegate; and Simon F., as a Youth Representative. The theme of the convention was "Living Our Baptized Life in Christ."

The English District is one of 35 districts of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Headquartered in Farmington, Michigan, the English District includes more than 150 congregations in 22 U.S. states and one Canadian province. Representatives of district congregations meet in convention every three years to elect officers for the district, debate and adopt resolutions, receive reports and updates from synod and district officials, and support one another in our common mission to proclaim the saving Gospel of Jesus Christ in our congregations and communities. Each congregation can send two voting delegates to the district convention: a pastoral delegate and a lay delegate.

**Bishop Jeffrey Miskus** was elected as our Bishop/District President. As the previous First Vice President of the district, Bishop Miskus became our bishop last August 1 when our former bishop, **Rev. Dr. Jamison Hardy**, accepted the call to serve as President of the Concordia University System. In other elections, **Pastor Michael Morehouse** of Catalina Lutheran Church in Tucson, Arizona, was elected First Vice President of the district, and **Pastor Mark Wood** of Shepherd of the Canyon Lutheran Church in Gold Canyon, Arizona, was elected to serve on the district's Board of Directors.

Even closer to home, my election as Circuit Visitor for Circuit 19, Arizona-North, was ratified by the convention. Circuit 19 consists of eight congregations: Eternal Life, Mesa; Shepherd of the Canyon, Gold Canyon; Family of Christ, Phoenix (Ahwatukee); Shepherd of the Pines, Payson; Faith, Overgaard; Shepherd of the Mountains, Pinetop; Messiah, Parker; and Prince of Peace, Mesquite, Nevada. (Thank you to **Pastor Resner** for faithfully serving as our circuit visitor the past four years.)

The circuit visitor represents and assists the bishop/district president as requested by him within the circuit. One of the primary duties of the circuit visitor is to assist congregations that are going through the call process for a pastor. Currently two congregations in our circuit are seeking a pastor: Shepherd of the Pines, Payson, and Messiah, Parker. The additional duties as circuit visitor will add to my workload somewhat, but I look forward to serving the congregations and pastors of our circuit. We are blessed to be a part of a wonderful circuit and district.

I enjoyed attending the English District Convention. As is often the case at these kinds of events, the best part of the convention was the numerous opportunities we had for worship and fellowship before, during, and after the business sessions. The opening and closing worship services in the

Concordia University chapel were particularly great. I will close by sharing the opening words of Bishop Miskus' report to the convention. Not only is it a beautiful summary of the theme of the convention, "Living Our Baptized Life in Christ," but it also wonderfully describes our daily life as God's baptized people:

In our baptisms we were united with Jesus Christ in his death and resurrection. God's act of grace gave us faith and new birth as His children.

In our baptisms we have been crucified and raised with Christ. Glory be to God!

*In our baptisms* our sins were washed away, and we were clothed with the holiness and righteousness of Jesus – we were fit for the very presence of God.

In our baptisms we were filled with God's Holy Spirit.

In our baptisms we were saved.

As baptized believers we are called each day to offer our lives as living sacrifices to God as they are now holy, righteous, and pleasing to God because of Jesus.

We are called to live the baptized life of repentance, faith, and love that we've been graciously given.

Not only is this beautiful revelation our convention theme, but it has been our district's vision for the past year and will be into the future.

# CHAIRMAN'S

At the July 20<sup>th</sup> voters' meeting, the voters approved placing the western portion of our property back on the market. This approval authorized the Chairman and Board of Trustees Chair, per Church constitution guidelines, to sign any LOI (Letter of Intent) initiating sales contract discussions with potential buyers. With Church Council consent, the Chairman would present any brokered agreement to the voters for their consideration and approval requiring 2/3 meeting support, again per Church constitution guidelines. Additionally, the voters authorized the Chairman to enlist a real estate agent and to consult with our real estate attorney, if imperative. The 2025 budget includes \$5,000 for attorney fees.

Developers referred to us by the City of Mesa recently submitted purchase offers to build a National Guard facility and another for single-family homes. Additionally, these offers included connecting the Church drain system to the city sewer line off S. 70<sup>th</sup> St., constructing a west- and north-facing border wall, and various levels of parking lot enhancements. City codes prevent any repair or replacement of our 60-year-old septic system. Having a developer connect us to the city sewer line would save the Church from having to incur this cost ourselves, currently estimated at \$179,223. This and any other improvements provided by a developer would result in substantial savings to our congregation. Initial efforts will concentrate on securing a sales agreement with one of the referred firms.

Thank you to all those who attended and participated in the meeting. Gratitude as well to Pastor Crane, Pastor Doughty, and the Church Council for their time and efforts in these matters.

#### From the English District Convention:



Initially, I was an empty, clear container placed inconspicuously at the back of the Convention hall. During his opening remarks at the Convention, Bishop Miskus referenced me, Mission 1-1-1, and encouraged attendees to learn more about the Mission 1-1-1 program: one member, one dollar, one week at a time

Throughout the first day, people followed the Bishop's suggestion by coming over to me and speaking with the person who could explain the 1-1-1 program. Several individuals made contributions. Members of the Mission Action Team wore badges that said, "Ask me about 1-1-1." By the end of the day, I was no longer empty; people were taking notice and talking about me. Communication and visibility were key in establishing momentum.

Day two saw continued efforts by the Mission Action Team and further response from Convention participants during session breaks, resulting in additional contributions and inquiries. An evening agenda item allowed Rev. Laughridge to elaborate on Mission 1-1-1's vision and emphasize the importance of ongoing communication and visibility for future success.

By the conclusion of the third day, participation continued to increase, with many individuals returning to contribute again. My sponsors, Rev. Reaman and Chuck Porter, were excited to learn that Convention attendees contributed a total of \$359 USD and \$20 CAD.

The Mission 1-1-1 objective was clearly supported through these collective efforts. Display your Mission 1-1-1 collection box prominently, be ready to explain its purpose, and be prepared to reach the lost for Jesus.

#### Jesus' transforming presence

"But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, 'Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.' Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost". (Luke 19:8-10 NIV)

Who knew, all those kids sitting in Sunday school were getting a lesson in stewardship! Generations of children have very often heard lessons based on the familiar account of Zacchaeus. The diminutive tax collector's curiosity surrounding the person and ministry of Jesus is what the Holy Spirit used to set him on a collision course for a total stewardship transformation. This transformation, according to the text of Luke 19, is not just about this life. This stewardship transformation is about eternity as well!

Remember the story: Zacchaeus was a tax collector. Do not think of friendly neighborhood IRS agents. This was more like a toll booth operator, but the governing authorities did not set the toll. They would contract men to staff roadside booths and tax the commerce that was passing along the road. This was an enterprise full of greed and graft. The tax collectors would take as much as they could and only pass on a portion to the government. The rest did not go into the community chest either! It went into the pocket of the tax collector.

This is why the people had such disdain for *Jewish* tax collectors. They were seen as both crooks and traitors. They were crooks in that they extorted their compatriots and others in the toll process. But worse, they were seen as traitors because their efforts supported the occupying Roman authorities. That is the real reason that the people would not make way so that short Zacchaeus could see Jesus.

For this reason, he runs ahead and climbs a tree. He had heard all the stories. He wanted to see this Jesus with his own eyes. Mercy is on display. This hated crook and traitor gets a direct audience with Jesus — at Jesus' own request! Jesus invites Himself to Zacchaeus' house. This is where the transformation is about to take place!

Notice how Jesus does it. He does not preach a three-week sermon series, nor does He ask Zacchaeus to make a pledge. There is nothing programmatic about Jesus' approach. But Zacchaeus is completely transformed! The transforming force is the very presence of Jesus! Direct time with Jesus takes a crooked, selfish, criminal and makes him the most faithful steward.

This new life of stewardship is marked by the promises made. First, he gives half of his ill-gotten gains to the poor. These are people whom he would not have defrauded at all! Yet, after spending time with Jesus, they are His first concern. Only after this does he double the requirement of the Levitical law on fraud. And what does Jesus say is the result? Salvation!

Doing the acts of stewardship does not save. Rather, the faith in Jesus that is created by the Holy Spirit is what saves! This is critical for us to confess. Failed stewardship can and will cut you off from God. The only antidote for failed stewardship is the presence of Jesus.

We do not need to run ahead and climb a tree for this presence of Jesus. He makes Himself available to us every week in the Divine Service. He speaks His Word of invitation to us in the pages of Holy Scripture. This, and this alone, transforms us from sinner to saint, from owner to steward of all that belongs to the Lord.

Do you want to become a more faithful steward? Spend more time with Jesus. Make the Divine Service a weekly priority. Feast on Christ's body and blood weekly! This is the great gift that brings salvation from God's House to yours!
