

A WORD ABOUT COMMUNION

The Holy Scriptures teach that Holy Communion is a sacred act, established by Christ Himself and given to His Church. As members of the **Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod**, we hold the doctrine of the *Real Presence*, meaning that Jesus really gives His Body and Blood in, with and under the bread and the wine, as He Himself says, "This is my body ... This is my blood ... for the forgiveness of sins" (Matthew 26:26ff.). To be clear, this is **not** a symbolic presence, but as the Bible declares – and the ancient church taught – a *Real Presence*.

The Holy Scriptures also teach us to receive this meal in a way that is responsible and healthy. As overseer, St. Paul wrote – "Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself" (1 Cor.11:28-29). Out of genuine care for God's people we ask that you **refrain from communing if** (1) you have not been baptized, (2) have not received basic instruction in the Christian Faith, (3) or you come from another church body, differing from these Scriptural teachings (mentioned above). If you have questions, please speak with the pastor or elder that we might further discuss the right reception of this sacred meal.

To prepare ourselves for the gifts our Lord gives, Luther encouraged us to ask 3 questions:

- Do I **REPENT** of my sins, desiring to turn away from them, back to the Lord?
- Do I **BELIEVE** Jesus died and rose for me and gives me His Body and Blood this day "for the forgiveness of sins"?
- Do I **INTEND** to use this means of grace to change my life, following His will & way?

- 1. If you receive the chalice please only take hold from the base and let the pastor guide it to your lips. Thank You
- 2. If you have difficulty kneeling due to surgery or chronic issues please feel free to stand at the communion rail.

OLD TESTAMENT READING: Exodus 13:17-22

Lector: When Pharaoh let the people go, God did not lead them by way of the

land of the Philistines, although that was near. For God said, "Lest the people change their minds when they see war and return to Egypt." But God led the people around by the way of the wilderness toward the Red Sea. And the people of Israel went up out of the land of Egypt equipped for battle. Moses took the bones of Joseph with him, for Joseph had made the sons of Israel solemnly swear, saying, "God will surely visit you, and you shall carry up my bones with you from here." And they moved on from Succoth and encamped at Etham, on the edge of the wilderness. And the Lord went before them by day in a pillar of cloud to lead them along the way, and by night in a pillar of cloud by day and

the pillar of fire by night did not depart from before the people.

EPISTLE READING: Hebrews 10:19-39

Lector: Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places

by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us draw near with a true heart in full

assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil

conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.

Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

For if we go on sinning deliberately after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, but a fearful expectation of judgment, and a fury of fire that will consume the adversaries. Anyone who has set aside the law of Moses dies without mercy on the evidence of two or three witnesses. How much worse punishment, do you think, will be deserved by the one who has trampled underfoot the Son of God, and has profaned the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified, and has outraged the Spirit of grace? For we know him who said, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay." And again, "The Lord will judge his people." It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.

But recall the former days when, after you were enlightened, you endured a hard struggle with sufferings, sometimes being publicly exposed to reproach and affliction, and sometimes being partners with those so treated. For you had compassion on those in prison, and you joyfully accepted the plundering of your property, since you knew that you yourselves had a better possession and an abiding one. Therefore do not throw away your confidence, which has a great reward. For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God you may receive what is promised. For,

"Yet a little while, and the coming one will come and will not delay; but my righteous one shall live by faith, and if he shrinks back, my soul has no pleasure in him."

But we are not of those who shrink back and are destroyed, but of those who have faith and preserve their souls.

This is the Word of the Lord.

GOSPEL READING: Luke 13-22-30

Pastor:

He went on his way through towns and villages, teaching and journeying toward Jerusalem. And someone said to him, "Lord, will those who are saved be few?" And he said to them, "Strive to enter through the narrow door. For many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able. When once the master of the house has risen and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, 'Lord, open to us,' then he will answer you, 'I do not know where you come from.' Then you will begin to say, 'We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets.' But he will say, 'I tell you, I do not know where you come from. Depart from me, all you workers of evil!'
