

### Behold the Man!



“Behold the man!” proclaimed the unwitting preacher Pontius Pilate in one of the shortest, yet most profound, sermons ever recorded. This will be our endeavor this Lententide and Easter Sunday. Behold the man, God in human flesh, Jesus. His incarnation will provide the basis for our meditation and proclamation on His Passion. And His real, bodily suffering and death will provide the basis for our full-throated proclamation on Easter morning of a bodily resurrection, not just of Jesus but also for His saints. Real bodies that have suffered, wept, bled, prayed, eaten, hoped, and more will be those raised incorruptible from their graves on the day of Jesus’ return.

We will fix our eyes and our preaching on the man Jesus, contemplating the inescapable fact—indeed the most important fact in the course of human history—that God became man. The Second Person of the eternal, triune God, who we confess in the Nicene Creed as “God of God, Light of light, very God of very God . . . of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made,” became a living, breathing, flesh-and-blood human being, a man.

In some ways, you can understand that the first heresy the Christian Church had to contend with was that of Gnosticism, the hyperspiritual religion that held that because no man could be God, the Christ could not be God. Gnosticism is alluring because it tidies everything up, gives Christianity a more attractive, spiritual veneer, and pulls its adherents out of the mire of this world and gives them something other-worldly to strive for.

Considered correctly, it becomes pretty hard to spiritualize Christianity—a religion that bases its existence on the enfleshment, the incarnation, of her God—into the mess of disembodied, matter-rejecting, hyperspiritual Gnosticism. When God has flesh and blood, skin and teeth, cells and nuclei, DNA and RNA, it’s difficult to contend for the disembodied spiritual against the material. If God has a body, bodies must matter.

This Lent, we will consider what it means that God became man. In preparation for the celebration of a real, bodily, flesh-and-blood, bone-and-sinew resurrection, the resurrection without which our faith and our preaching are all in vain, consider the body of Jesus that exists in order to be nailed to a cross. The spiritual, bodyless Son of God became the embodied, enfleshed, incarnate Son of Mary. In Jesus, God has human flesh, a body, just like you. What could be more profound?

Each week, we’ll consider a different aspect of the body of Jesus Christ. What does it mean that, in Jesus, God has hands, feet, lungs, lips, eyes, and ears?

Behold the man! In sermon, in study, in devotion, behold the man!

*In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him was not anything made that was made. . . . The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, the glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.*

—John 1:1–3, 14

## March Issue—Applying Biblical Teachings

“For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. . .” (1 Tim. 6:10). Friendships have been destroyed by it. Families have been torn apart by it. Marriages have been wrecked by it. Lives have been ruined by it. “. . . Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith. . .” (1 Tim. 6:10).

Solomon wisely observed, “Whoever loves money never has money enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with his income. This too is meaningless” (Eccl. 5:10). If one loves money, he devotes himself to it. He focuses, he plots, he schemes, he labors to acquire more. He lets nothing stand between him and the obtaining of his wealth. But the securing of this wealth is meaningless. It is as if one were chasing the wind.

Jesus said, “What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul?” (Mark 8:36). And St. Paul went on to instruct Timothy, “For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it” (1 Tim. 6:7). The worldly pleasures and comfort that money can buy are only short-lived. Compared to eternity, our life is less than a blink of an eye. That which we have accumulated is gone. Naked again, we depart this life.

By the working of the Holy Spirit through Word and Sacrament, we have been brought to faith in Christ and to the realization that He, the risen Lord and Savior, reigns in our lives. He will make use of the money and wealth He has given us to do His work. In Christ, we are content with that and go about our labor with the realization that “. . . godliness with contentment is great gain” (1 Tim. 6:6).

In Jesus’ name, we ask for forgiveness when our love turns from Him. We ask that He, through Word and Sacrament, continually strengthen us in our faith. We ask that He guide us to use our money and wealth in a God-pleasing manner.

“Whoever trusts in his riches will fall, but the righteous will thrive like a green leaf” (Prov. 11:28).

## April Issue—Applying Biblical Teachings

“Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, ‘Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you’” (Hebrews 13:5).

If one were to look for an example of a person who lived a life of contentment, one need look no farther than the Apostle Paul. Whether he served the Lord as a laborer, a preacher, or a writer, he was content. Whether food was plentiful or scarce, he was content. Whether he lived in a fine house or was confined in prison, he was content. Whether he faced the dangers of the road, the perils of the sea, or the hatred of his enemies, he was content.

Matthew Henry wrote, “Haman was the great court-favorite, and yet not contented; Ahab on the throne, and yet not contented; Adam in paradise, and yet not contented; yea, the angels in heaven, and yet not contented; but Paul, though abased and empty, had learned in every state, in any state, therewith to be contented.”

Paul understood what Jesus meant when He said, “This, then, is how you should pray: ‘Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name . . . Give us today our daily bread. . . .’” (Matt. 6:9, 11) and when He said, “Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own” (Matt. 6:34).

By the power of the Word and the work of the Holy Spirit, the Apostle Paul had personal knowledge of God’s divine grace. He had genuine confidence in the grace of God. He knew that after all that God had done for him, through Jesus Christ, he would never be left or forsaken. He trusted that God would be with him every day, providing what he needed that day for his ministry. The Apostle had complete trust in God and was content.

Often we find it difficult to be content. We find ourselves uncomfortable and insecure as we look to the future. We are tempted to look to our money and wealth as the source of our security. We are tempted to put our trust in what we have accumulated. We are tempted to love and trust our money.

We must never forget that “. . . God has said, ‘Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you’” (Hebrews 13:5). After all that God has done for us, through Jesus Christ, He will daily provide all that is necessary to sustain this life, to do the good works we were meant to do and to carry out His work of salvation. With that, we are content.



# Minutes From Faith Lutheran Church Voters Meeting

February 21, 2019

**In attendance**— Dean Ayers, Tom and Chris Buckthorpe, Pastor Moyer, Sharon Vogel, Karen Cowart, Mike Stanley, Sherry Hanovich, Guy York, Steve Tino, Neil Hornbacher, Laura Hornbacher, Kathy VanGordon, and Janet Adler

The Voters Assembly was called to order by President, Dean Ayers at 7:32 p.m. Tom started the meeting with our Opening Prayer. Pastor read Hebrews 12 and summarized that we face many changes but we can find comfort in the Kingdom of God that cannot be shaken.

Previous meeting minutes were read by Sherry Hanovich. Dean requested a correction on the Treasurers report. "Surplus funds were placed in our boiler fund not the pavilion fund."

**Pastor's Report** – Pastor Moyer reported Guy York will be attending the Steven Ministry training the fourth Thursday of each month. He will also attend leadership training in April. Pastor is also considering offering small group caregiver training. Pastor suggested we consider having a new member Sunday during Lent.

**Board of Education** – Laura presented January and February meeting minutes for the BOE. Tracy is requesting help with the planning and executing of Faith Legacy events. Some of the students in the confirmation classes are close to being prepared for confirmation. A 65" Samsung TV and stand were ordered. Youth group will be putting on a Trivia night and has room for more teams to sign up. Pastor gave the group a Bible Dictionary that was donated by Marcella. It will be kept on the top shelf of the closet with the Bibles. Last day of Sunday School is May 19<sup>th</sup>.

**Board of Elders** – Mike Stanley reported that Sherry Hanovich gave a presentation on "How do you want visitors to view us?". A workshop to discuss and put together a 5-year plan will take place April/May. Pastor will be conducting communion classes for 4<sup>th</sup> grade and up. There will be three classes: March 31, April 7 and April 14<sup>th</sup>. There will be a Crucifer and procession for both Easter Sunday Services.

**The Board of Faith Family and Community Outreach**—Kathy VanGordon reported for the board. She said the results of the congregation survey showed the majority of people would prefer a Trivia night. The Trivia night will be held in September. The Outreach Committee will be hosting the Lenten dinner on April 3<sup>rd</sup>. The group saw the "How do you want visitors to see us?" presentation.

**Board of Trustees** – Steve Tino reported our church is running on one boiler for the rest of the heating season, our secondary boiler is no longer safe to operate, it has been disconnected. We are gathering bids now so we can install a new boiler system later this spring.

The trustees are having a work bee towards the middle of March, and we are having our spring clean-up for the inside of the building the first part of April to be ready for Easter. This date will be posted on your April calendar. Steve read a letter from Life Line Screening requesting to use our facility for one day in May. Life Line is a mobile health unit which provides screening to over one million people each year.

**Treasurers Report**—The treasurers report was presented by Dean. Chris motioned to accept report, Steve Tino seconded and all approved. Report on file.

**Music Ministry** – Sherry read Jacqueline's report. The music and liturgy for Holy Week is being finalized. Choir has begun practicing and will continue through Wed., February 27<sup>th</sup>. Choir will participate in services beginning Ash Wednesday continuing through Easter.

**Old Business** – Sherry explained that we are out of contract with our phones and internet. Pricing and optional plans are being considered. Dean is reaching out to a Technology advisor to evaluate our needs and recommend efficient, reliable services.

**New Business** – Tom Buckthorpe received a request from Venom baseball for use of our ball field. They have used our field in the past and have helped in its maintenance. They will supply their own insurance. Tom received information from Life Line for CPR/AED/First Aide training. Training would be a 4-5-hour class on a Saturday. Pastor suggested that Parish nurses may also provide training. Tom will look into it. Tom also announced there is a \$5,000 scholarship available from Church Mutual. The battery in the AED has been changed.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m. by Dean. Tom closed the meeting with our closing prayer and the Lord's Prayer.
