Communion Policy Statement

St. Paul writes, **"Let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of this bread and drink of this cup."** The Sacrament of Holy Communion is for those who have been instructed in the Christian faith and have a proper understanding of the meaning of Holy Communion as taught at Faith Lutheran, a member congregation of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. We believe that in this Sacrament Jesus gives His real body and blood for the forgiveness of sins, and in receiving this gift we promise to love God and others. A great way to prepare for the Supper is by reviewing Martin Luther's "Christian Questions with Their Answers" on pp. 329ff in the hymnal. If you have not been instructed in this understanding of Holy Communion, please consult with the pastor before communing. **All children and adults who have not yet been instructed** are **welcome to come to the altar for a blessing**, simply **crossing their arms on their chest.** Gluten-free wafers and nonalcoholic wine are also available. Stephen Ministry

Feelings: God gave man the gift of feelings. He knows all the feelings Man has. Jesus experienced them all. He wept, He mourned, He thirst, He laughed. Feelings are natural. How we react

to those feelings vary, is human and is affected by sin. Christ centered reactions to feelings are generally positive – "that guy just cut me off – maybe he is confused and didn't realize what he was doing. God be with him". Or it may be self-centered - "that guy just cut me off – I could have been killed. That so-in-so should be punished".

Often people overwhelmed by their feelings react by yelling, screaming, and hatred that chase friends and family away. Consider the spouse or parent of these individuals. Stephen Ministry provides distinct tools to trained "care givers" to listen to people so hurting that their feelings may, or have chased away their very support group. Hundreds of Stephen Ministers in the Metro Detroit area provide distinctively Christian Caring to serve people who express their feelings in very hurtful ways. As you pray for guidance in dealing with your feelings and how you and your loved ones react to those feelings, pray also for those Stephen Ministers, for our Stephen Minister.
