The word *hope* is used in the Bible about 150 times. I say about that many times because it varies depending on the English translation you're using. The word hope can cover concepts like wish or expectation and the translators will choose different words, including hope, to convey the intended meaning.

My kids may have said "I hope I get a PlayStation 5 for Christmas." They didn't. It was a misplaced hope. Many people are putting their hope in the year 2021. As if the numbers on the calendar are what cause or affect the circumstances just because our collective lap counter around Sol went up by one. We certainly understand the yearning for a "happy new year" but buying a new day planner does not make it so. (Worst purchase of 2020, by the way.)

For the Christian, hope is not a wish. It is a trust. It is the expectation that the Lord of hosts will continue to do as he promised, and that those promises are for the ultimate good of his people. It's also the belief that what our Lord says is true, despite popular opinion.



Minutes from Faith Lutheran Church Voters Meeting

December 16, 2020

The Voters Assembly was called to order by President, Dean Ayers at 7:55 p.m. Dean started the meeting with the opening prayer.

Previous meeting minutes were read by Sherry Hanovich. Dean requested the minutes be amended to add the budget approval and clarify "new sound system" to new camera, laptop for recording services and monitoring the sanctuary. Sharon motioned to accept minutes, Mike Stanley seconded and all approved.

Pastors Report – Pastor continues to make visits to those who are accepting visitors. ~Most of his efforts are towards Christmas prep. ~There will be a guest speaker, Carl Petzel, the first week in January.

Board of Family & Community Outreach – Kathy VanGordon reported for the Board of Outreach. ~The outreach group was able to help a needy family by donating \$750.

Board of Elders – Bill Kiley reported for the Board of Elders. ~The board discussed the new video closed circuit system. It will be up and running by Christmas. ~All elders have been assigned to accommodate all Christmas services. Each elder is invited to attend any service, whether they are on duty or not. ~As Tom Lombardo and Neil Hornbacher will be elected President and Vice President for 2021, they need to renounce their remaining elected terms as elders. Both will be appointed as elders for 2021. Dean Ayers, Bill Kiley and Carl Lemke will be appointed as elders for 2021. ~Installation of new officers will be January 3, 2021. ~All elders are encouraged to contact their parishioners' during the Holiday Season.

Trustees – Dean reported for the Board of Trustees. ~The photo sensor was replaced in the M-59 church sign. ~Thank you to Dean for compacting the gravel in the new parking lot. ~The exterior stairs that lead from the lower lot to the upper lot will be blocked from usage, it will be difficult to keep safe for use. ~Dean and Steve are working towards a grant for updated security improvements. ~A big thank you to Tom Tesolin, Mike Stanley and Brian Zeremba for installing our new camera system for recording on-line services.

Treasurers Report – Bill Erfourth presented the November Treasurers report. ~There was discussion on redirecting funds from St. Georges to the Outreach Committee where it can be dispersed as needed. Mike Stanley motioned to accept the report, Bill Kiley seconded, and all approved.

Stephen Ministry – Mike Stanley reported that the group continues to meet bi-weekly, however the Nelson's are back in Arizona, and JoAnn Ruczynski will be leaving for Florida. ~Guy has been talking to Amanda Vergin, wife of Pastor Aaron Vergin – St. Mark's West Bloomfield. She is a professional counselor, as well as, Stephen Leader and Minister. She has offered to assist us with training that will help deal with concerns regarding Mental Health of our Care Receivers. ~A Community Resource Directory is being developed. ~Please continue to pray for the Stephen Ministry program.

Music Ministry – Jacque explained that all music for Christmas will be from the organ, there will not be any special groups or instruments.

Voting Member Instated – Bill Kiley motioned that Barb Steele be installed as a voting member. Mike Stanley seconded, all approved.

New Business – Bill motioned that we compensate our guest speakers who provide the sermon, \$150. Cindy seconded, all approved. ~Pastor explained that due to Covid, conventions have not been able to take place. The Synod requests that each church body vote whether to approve a recommended one-year delay of conventions. Cindy motioned to approve, Bill Erfourth seconded, all approved. ~Bill Erfourth motioned that Pastor Moyer's 2021 housing allowance continue unchanged from 2020. Kathy seconded, all approved. ~Jacque received a \$111 cash donation for the Children's program. ~Cindy motioned that we reallocate the money for St. George's to the Outreach Committee. Mike Stanley seconded, all approved. ~Dean announced the installation of officers will be January 3, 2021, in both services. ~Dean read off the 2021 Ballot of Officers (attached). Jacque motioned to accept the ballot as proposed, Mike Stanley seconded, all approved. ~Kathy thanked all the exiting officers for their years of service and dedication.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m. by Dean. Dean closed the meeting with our closing prayer and the Lord's Prayer.

**This is what was shared at church in December by the Elder speaker.
We thought you would enjoy reading it.**

The soil is tilled and properly prepared. An excess of seed is on hand. It is the right time of the year to sow, and so the sowing begins. A small handful of seed here, a light sprinkling of seed in a few spots, and maybe a couple of seeds over there. Now the anticipation sets in for what is hoped for: A lush, thick, dark green lawn.

Would it surprise you that the result is not much of a lawn at all? Why, you might ask, would anyone who has more than enough seed sow in such a manner?

But is this not frequently the scenario of God's people when it comes to giving to the Lord? Great wealth abounds, but instead of scattering that wealth for the furtherance of the Gospel, pennies, nickels and dimes are cast here and there as they are carefully counted out by the giver. Such was the situation that the Apostle Paul addressed in his second letter to the Corinthians. The collection for the church in Jerusalem had fallen behind. Great enthusiasm over generously helping fellow members of the body of Christ had degenerated into occasional and less than generous giving. It was time to bring the offering to completion, for soon it would be taken to Jerusalem, where it was desperately needed.

The Apostle writes, "Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God."

The Apostle wants to make several points with this seed-sowing imagery. It is God who provides the seed, and it is God who provides the giver with money and wealth as the means to give. It is God who blesses the seed so that it brings forth a bountiful harvest. In a similar way, our gifts of money bring glory and honor to God and produce thanksgiving because of what He has done for us through Jesus Christ. And it is God who strengthens us in our lives of sanctification so that we may grow in this grace of cheerful giving.

We must never let the focus of the sinful world influence our values concerning giving. The world's reasoning will leave us selfish, giving stingily unless we are sure there will be a direct benefit to us. The world's wisdom will have us looking at the Lord's work here at Faith Lutheran Church as little more than a business with income and expense projections, returns on investments, and a budget to be funded.

As God's people, focused on Him, we rise to the challenge and give generously to meet the needs which God has set before us. We give as an act of love towards God, brought about by His grace in Christ, knowing that He has already made provisions so that we might be able to give. And, with God as our source, we know that our giving will be blessed beyond any human measure.

We are blessed with abundant seed. Pray that by God's grace in Jesus Christ, we may broadcast this seed liberally and abundantly as He provides, giving Him the glory and thanks for His bountiful harvest.

Applying Biblical Teachings

Here's a little true or false test. Be forewarned that the question is somewhat tricky. True or false: A Christian can expect to have all of his or her needs supplied by God.

On the surface, that would seem to be true. After all, Philippians 4:19 says, "And my God will meet all your needs according to his glorious riches in Christ Jesus." But what many people fail to realize is that this promise is a conditional promise. The reason God will supply all of our needs is based on Philippians 4:18 where the Apostle Paul describes how his needs were met by the Christians at Philippi through the sacrificial offering which they had sent to him.

In other words, although those first-century Christians gave to Paul with the desire of assisting him in his ministry to the early church, because of their giving, they earned the "right" to expect that God would fully meet all of their needs. Because of their willingness to share their resources with Paul, as he indicated in Philippians 4:17, fruit would abound to their account. They could then look to God to supply all of their needs. Although they did not "give to get," they would "get" because they gave.

That same principle holds true today. As one person expressed it so well, "We do not give to get, but when we give, we get." That's what the Lord Jesus said in Luke 6:38. He indicated that by whatever measure we give, we will in turn receive.

Jack Hartman, a Christian businessman, said it this way: ". . . the more we give to God, the more this opens the channel for Him to see that we receive abundantly in return. If we withhold our giving, we are actually withholding the blessing that God wants to give us."

Someone described non-essentials in life as ". . . playing Scrabble on the *Hindenburg* or rearranging deck chairs on the *Titanic*." Maybe that's a picture of how you view giving — as a non-essential, something not very important in the totality of life. Could it be that is why your needs are not being met in full?

Think about this: What would happen if you began to place a rightful priority on your giving, even to the point of giving sacrificially? You see, you would then have the "right" to claim Philippians 4:19 with the expectation that in response to your giving, God would meet all of your needs. Your obedience to God's direction in your life to give would then result in having Him meet your needs, even with the same "measure" that you give to Him.


Merry Christmas from Jack & Leah Nicholas

January we will begin a new study called “The Armor God” (for teen/young adults).



A Note to the Saints at Faith Lutheran Church regarding Stephen Ministry

As I have come to know members of Faith Church since Diane and I joined our congregation a few short years ago I am profoundly mindful of the care and concern you have, not just for one another but for your friends and acquaintances. I often hear about phone calls and visits between members and by members to their friends and neighbors. Because of my role as Stephen Leader I am either made aware of hurting members and others or learn of them through conversation with you and other means such as the prayer chain postings. How blessed we are to be part of such a Christ-centered, Spirit-filled, loving congregation.

Each of us at various times are put in positions where family members need our support when faced with life changing issues. Often the burden of dealing with these issues is more than they can bear alone. They don't directly ask for our support, but we know they need it. Sometimes in trying to be supportive we say something in a way that sets them off in rage. We get scolded or harshly responded to when all we are really trying to do is be helpful, sympathetic and supportive. This is an obvious sign that the burden has become extreme. When these reactions become routine is when the care receiver needs help the most. Patience and a little skill become necessary to manage these reactions so they don't become a deep divide that ends the relationship.

Since its founding in 1975, Stephen Ministry of St. Louis has published many helpful guides on learning how to communicate with over-burdened individuals who have chased away family members, leaving them alone to deal with their feelings. While some of these publications are specific to illness, aging, death and dying, they also deal with such struggles as coping, loss of a job, divorce, moving/geographic-relocation, parenting, criticism, faith building, and evangelism. If you would like to know more about Stephen Ministry in general or the Faith Stephen Ministry mission, please contact Pastor Moyer or me. In the meantime, continue to pray for a patient heart and the Mind of Christ to deal with hurtful reactions from loved-ones. Pray also for our Stephen Ministry program at Faith and for those who are contemplating becoming a Stephen Minister.

Thank-you and God Bless You as you call on, comfort and care for your hurting friends and acquaintances. You are doing work Christ means for you to do. Lead by the Holy Spirit, Paul wrote ***Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ - Galatians 6:2***


