Communion Policy Statement

St. Paul writes, "Let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of this bread and drink of this cup." The Sacrament of Holy Communion is for those who have been instructed in the Christian faith and have a proper understanding of the meaning of Holy Communion as taught at Faith Lutheran, a member congregation of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. We believe that in this Sacrament Jesus gives His real body and blood for the forgiveness of sins, and in receiving this gift we promise to love God and others. A great way to prepare for the Supper is by reviewing Martin Luther's "Christian Questions with Their Answers" on pp. 329ff in the hymnal. If you have not been instructed in this understanding of Holy Communion, please consult with the pastor before communing. All children and adults who have not yet been instructed are welcome to come to the altar for a blessing, simply crossing their arms on their chest. Gluten-free wafers and nonalcoholic wine are also available. Please contact an elder if you have further questions.

Old Testament Reading: 1 Samuel 3:1–20

¹The young man Samuel was ministering to the LORD under Eli. And the word of the LORD was rare in those days; there was no frequent vision.

²At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his own place. ³The lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the LORD, where the ark of God was.

⁴Then the LORD called Samuel, and he said, "Here I am!" ⁵and ran to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down.

⁶And the LORD called again, "Samuel!" and Samuel arose and went to Eli and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." ⁷Now Samuel did not yet know the LORD, and the word of the LORD had not yet been revealed to him.


Epistle: 1 Corinthians 6:12-20

¹²"All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be enslaved by anything. ¹³"Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food"—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. ¹⁴And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. ¹⁵Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! ¹⁶Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? 

Did you See?!!

Last Sunday, we changed altar colors from Christmas beige to white. Today, our colors are changed to green. Have you ever considered why?

This month we entered the season of Epiphany and it focuses on the events that identify Jesus to the world. For example, last Sunday we celebrated Jesus' baptism. The baptism of Our Lord is a feast day of Jesus. The color is white, the color of divinity, purity, and joy. Now, the time after the Epiphany focuses on the increase of Jesus' ministry, and green is used to symbolize this growth by our ever-present Lord. Another color change should take place in several weeks. Watch and see with what you might associate it.



Stephen Ministry

The hardest part of caregiving is listening. Thinking about your family, whether members of your household or extended or friends and acquaintances, everyone has issues they are dealing with.

These issues create feelings, some of which are hard to deal with. When people share their feelings with us our natural response is to tell them how they should deal with their feelings - what they should do or how we would manage the same feelings. This approach can be wrong, and in many cases should be avoided. This response invalidates their feelings, which they are entitled to. You can have empathy, but that can be mis-read as invalidation. Effective caregivers allow the hurting souls to express their feelings to the deepest extent necessary. This can be very hard to hear. Good questions that promote further expression of the hurt will be of great benefit to the care receiver even if there is the extended release of anger and heavy crying (by both of you). As you pray for the patience to listen and to be a good listener, pray also for Stephen Ministers across Metro Detroit that provide distinctively Christian Caring by listening. Pray also for our Stephen Ministers, the Faith Stephen Ministry Program and for those who are contemplating becoming a Stephen Minister.
