Communion Policy Statement

St. Paul writes, **"Let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of this bread and drink of this cup."** The Sacrament of Holy Communion is for those who have been instructed in the Christian faith and have a proper understanding of the meaning of Holy Communion as taught at Faith Lutheran, a member congregation of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. We believe that in this Sacrament Jesus gives His real body and blood for the forgiveness of sins, and in receiving this gift we promise to love God and others. A great way to prepare for the Supper is by reviewing Martin Luther's "Christian Questions with Their Answers" on pp. 329ff in the hymnal. If you have not been instructed in this understanding of Holy Communion, please consult with the pastor before communing. **All children and adults who have not yet been instructed** are **welcome to come to the altar for a blessing**, simply **crossing their arms on their chest.** Gluten-free wafers and nonalcoholic wine are also available. Please contact an elder if you have further questions.

Stephen Ministry - What happens during a visit with my Stephen Minister? Before you begin your regular visits with your Stephen Minister, the central need is identified based on the stressful challenges with which you are suffering – things like surgery or hospitalization, divorce, grief due to a loss, aging,

terminal illness, relocation, retirement or loneliness. Your meetings will allow you to express how you are feeling about these challenges and how you are dealing with your feelings. When you are down and having a bad day, conversation will become harsh, emotional. Crying and anger are often involved. So is hugging, sharing bible verses or hymns and prayer. You will share with your care giver things you wouldn't or couldn't say to anyone else. One thing you can be sure of – everything that is discussed, 100% will be held in strict confidence. No one will know what you and your Care Giver discuss. As you prayerfully consider arranging for a Stephen Minister for yourself or a loved one, pray also for our Stephen Ministers at Faith and our Stephen Ministry Program. If you sense the Lord leading you in the direction of becoming a trained Stephen Minister, reach out to Pastor Moyer or Guy York to discuss our Stephen Ministry program. We would like to share with you the bountiful joys that are yours when you have the opportunity to serve God by caring for others through this mission.
