Communion Policy Statement

St. Paul writes, "**Let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of this bread and drink of this cup.**" The Sacrament of Holy Communion is for those who have been instructed in the Christian faith and have a proper understanding of the meaning of Holy Communion as taught at Faith Lutheran, a member congregation of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. We believe that in this Sacrament Jesus gives His real body and blood for the forgiveness of sins, and in receiving this gift we promise to love God and others. A great way to prepare for the Supper is by reviewing Martin Luther's "Christian Questions with Their Answers" on pp. 329ff in the hymnal. If you have not been instructed in this understanding of Holy Communion, please consult with the pastor before communing. **All children and adults who have not yet been instructed are welcome to come to the altar for a blessing, simply crossing their arms on their chest.** Gluten-free wafers and nonalcoholic wine are also available. Please contact an elder if you have further questions.

"Lord, who has believed what he heard from us,

⁴⁰"He has blinded their eyes
and hardened their heart,
lest they see with their eyes,

⁴²Nevertheless, many even of the authorities believed in him, but for fear of the Pharisees they did not confess it, so that they would not be put out of the synagogue; ⁴³for they loved the glory that comes from man more than the glory that comes from God.



Stephen Ministry - Happy Palm Sunday – the day we celebrate the ride of the King of Kings into the city. During the three years of Jesus ministry, word spread that the Messiah had come. The crowd who had heard about Jesus preceded him into the city. They cheered and spread their clothes and palm branches on the road. All of Jerusalem came out to see what was happening and asked, “Who is this?” The crowd said to them “This is the prophet Jesus”, **Matt 21: 8-11**. A few days later another crowd, all riled up by the chief priests asked Pilate to release Barabbas and not Jesus, **Mark 15:11**, which lead to his crucifixion.



Examples of hearing information and acting on what was heard are described above. On Palm Sunday, Jesus’ followers shared stories about Jesus to the people of Jerusalem watching his triumphal entry to the city. A few days later a crowd of people stirred up by the words of their leaders told Pilate to crucify Jesus.

Spoken words create reactions by the listener. Some barely a reaction – going in one ear and out the other. On the other hand, the reaction could be an extreme emotional release. Hurting people overwhelmed with the challenges they are facing will say things or react in extremes to things they hear. People attending meetings, a parent, sibling or a friend must take these things into consideration and be prepared for harsh or bitter responses in conversation.

Stephen Ministers use distinctively Christian Caring principles to listen to care receivers to help them release the feelings that are boiling up inside. As you pray for guidance in helping someone express and release their bottled up feelings, pray also for our Stephen Ministry Program at Faith, for those who serve and for those who are contemplating becoming a Stephen Minister.

We appreciate your patience as we all adapt to these new circumstances.
