





Epistle 1 Thessalonians 5:1–11

A The Epistle is from 1 Thessalonians, chapter 5.

¹Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers, you have no need to have anything written to you. ²For you yourselves are fully aware that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. ³While people are saying, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. ⁴But you are not in darkness, brothers, for that day to surprise you like a thief. ⁵For you are all children of light, children of the day. Apostles' Creed


G I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.


The Words of Our Lord
