HOLY COMMUNION is a visible means by which our Lord Jesus Christ forgives our sins and strengthens our faith through our reception of His true body and blood in mystical union with the bread and wine. We do not believe that the Supper is simply a memorial meal or that the bread and wine simply symbolize Christ's body and blood. Because of Jesus' words, "This is my body...this is my blood..." we believe that Jesus is really, truly, present in, with, and under the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper. Participation in the Lord's Supper is a confession that you share these beliefs. Out of love and concern for your spiritual welfare, and not a desire to be exclusionary, we ask that those who do not yet share this understanding and confession of the Sacrament refrain from communing until they have been instructed in our beliefs regarding this Sacrament and brought into fellowship with us. If you are a visitor, we ask that you speak with the pastor or an elder before communing.


