Traditionally celebrated the first Sunday in October, Lutheran Women in Mission Sunday can be celebrated any time.



#### July/August/September 2023 "I Will Give You Rest", Camp Linn Haven, Linville, NC

"I Will Give You Rest" is a campaign at Camp Linn Haven to replace mattresses in the cabins. The cost to replace mattresses in 19 cabins and purchase covers is \$36,000.00. Linn Haven is a Christian camp that provides certain weeks for families, teens, preteens, quilters, seniors, and artist to enjoy a week in the mountains in a safe, friendly Christian atmosphere. Morning and evening devotions are held each week. During the Teen week, the teens fill back packs with school supplies as a servant event to give to Avery County, NC schools. During all of the weeks the people that come to camp enjoy the beauty of God's creation, make new friends, enjoy Christian fellowship and have a chance to reflect on God's blessings. By helping with the campaign, it will provide a comfortable mattress that will help give campers a good night rest allowing them to awake refreshed and ready to enjoy God's beauty in their surroundings, make lasting friendships, and deepen and strengthen their relationship with their Lord and Savior.

#### October/November/December 2023 St. Stephens Healthcare Ministry, Hickory, NC

St. Stephens Healthcare Ministry is an ongoing mission which consist of monthly blood pressure checks and providing funds for people unable to pay for their medicine or visits to their physician. These funds are available to a recipient every three months if needed. All recipients are approved by the Pastor. Also cards of Get Well, Thinking of You, Sympathy, etc. are mailed to people in need of being thought of each week.

#### January/February/March 2024 Eastern Catawba Cooperative Ministry (ECCM), Newton, NC

ECCM began in 1969 as a crisis ministry funded and operated by local churches, including Concordia Lutheran Church in Conover and the Dorcas Society of Concordia. It has grown through the years: more people live in the area, many jobs were lost or devalued when manufacturing landscape changed, and consequently there is more poverty and hunger. Typical assistance (motto is "A helping hand up, not a hand out") consists of food, clothing, referrals, life skills coaching, and assistance with utility bills. For many years, much of Catawba County was served by a sister organization, Cooperative Christian Ministry of Hickory (CCM), while ECCM ministered to crisis needs in the rest of the county. However, recently CCM closed its food pantry and clothing ministry in order to focus entirely on its medical clinic outreach. This leaves ECCM, still supported by local churches and staffed mostly with volunteers, to respond to the crisis needs of persons throughout Catawba County. It is a recognized 501(c)3 organization with nearly all donations going directly to clients.

#### FOCUS ON JESUS

While at convention I was privileged to attend the Focus on Jesus Seminary. Here is a description of what the program is about.

Focus on Jesus is a series of presentations about Lutheran Women in Mission and is based on the mission statement of the LWML. This information can be shared as a

refresher at a local, zone or district event. It can be shared with women new to the congregation or a woman in the congregation who is unfamiliar with Lutheran Women in Mission. This program is broken down into 5 presentations.



**Facts** – Who We Are: If you are new to LWML, or are interested in more information about the organization as we FOCUS on Jesus, we will look at the fact about Lutheran Women in Mission.

We are Christian Women, We are in God's Word, We are mission-focused, We are sisters in Christ who value and benefit from each other, and we are Servant Leaders. LWML's vision statement is each LCMS woman is welcomed and encouraged to use her unique God-give gifts as she serves the Lord with Gladness and supports global missions.

#### Our Preparation for Service- How We Equip

Engage and involve each woman in the congregation. Recognize and reach out to all women as God's children, each with God-given gifts. Promote and encourage the use of the LWML resources in innovative ways: podcast, group resources, mite calendar, mailbox member program, videos, emails, blog, social media, downloadable resources.

Leadership Development: Resources and guidance for leader development and mentoring, event planning and training. Create Resources and products for all stages of life: the Word: bible studies, devotions; Program resources; LWML Store; Lutheran Woman's Quarterly.

#### Christ Centered – Why We Go

Inspire women to be in the Word. There are bible studies made specifically for LWML. Volunteer to be the facilitator for a regular group Bible study. There are many wonderful resources on the LWML website for your use. Connect people to scripturally-based resources in multiple formats such as LWML on the web, Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Pinterest, YouTube, the LWML app, president's blog and the LWML podcast.

#### Unified Message – We Proclaim Christ Near and Far

Pray for missions and missionaries. Each month LWML provides resources about one of the biennium's mission grants. Two of the resources are a prayer guide with five different prayers and a devotion specific to the grant. Invite a missionary to speak at your church, take advantage of the various coloring resources on the website to connect with missionaries, or use the Gospel Outreach Missionary Care Flyer which contains valuable information on how to put together and send a care package.

#### Serving Others – How We Help

Acknowledge and value all acts of service. Remember church workers in their ministry. Use the resources found on the website of ideas on how to appreciate and support the church workers in your life. Develop servant activity ideas such as Gifts from the Heart, mission service activities.

Lutheran Women in Mission is for all Lutheran women in mission, no matter their station in life or their age. LWML strives to provide materials to serve others at all ages and to serve God and spread the good news of Jesus. I hope that you will use this new program in your congregation, local group, zone or district.

#### Structure/ByLaws

On June 23, 2023, I attended the Structure/Bylaws Pre-Convention Seminar 2023 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin at the LWML 40th Biennial Convention. The Workshop was conducted by the LWML Structure Committee. The seminar highlighted Bylaw Amendments – What's the Big Deal? We should make bylaws as simple as we can.

#### Why are bylaws important?

Bylaws contain an organization's own basic rules relating to itself, rather than to the parliamentary procedure that it follows (Robert Rules of Order). They define the primary characteristics of the organization the bylaws prescribe how the organization functions and include all rules that the organization considers so important that they cannot be changed without notice and a large majority. They can't be suspended.

Amendments to the Bylaws is to change something previously adopted. Special requirements for this motion's adoption should be specified in the bylaws.

At the seminar steps in making a motion and amending a motion was also discussed.

Bylaw Amendments and Notice was discussed. A 90-day notice is required before a vote can be taken. We cannot ask for a motion at our Convention if the notice has not been sent.

Standing Rules are different from Policies and Procedures. We should review our District and Zone Bylaws every other year. Dates on Bylaws are important (use footnotes).

Keep the Bylaws as simple as possible. District Bylaws should include the Five (5) Basics: Name, Purpose, Members, Convention and Parliamentary Authority.
