Charlie Brown's young friend Linus made the mistake of confessing to his big sister Lucy that he wanted to be a doctor when he grew up. Lucy was astounded at her brother's declaration. "You, a doctor!" That's a laugh! You could never be a doctor! You know why? Because you don't love humankind!" Young Linus immediately responded, "I do love humankind! It's people I can't stand!"



Linus' comment may give us a chuckle. We find humor in it because we identify with Linus. Apart from the power of God's Spirit working in us, our love for others is weak and shallow at best. But God calls us to love all people and enables us to do so. Whether we are doctors, carpenters, policemen, teachers, secretaries, or plumbers, we are to love those with whom we work with as well as all people. God places us in different vocations where we can share God's love. We are His instruments through which He works. In his letter to the church in Corinth, the Apostle Paul wrote, "Only let each person lead the life that the Lord has assigned to him, and to which God has called him" (1 Corinthians 7:17).

God has a purpose, a plan, in mind for each of us. Like Linus, one might consider being a doctor, but God may have a much different vocation in mind. No vocation is to be viewed higher or lower than another, and we are called, regardless of where we are placed by God, to let His love within us overflow to others.

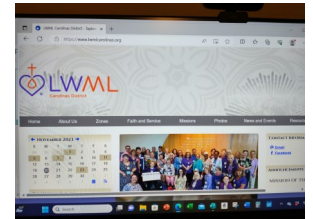

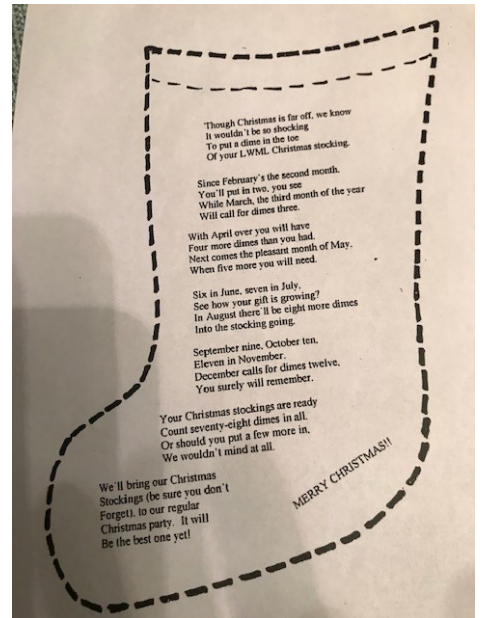
Red Stocking Special Christmas Mites Project

For well over 25 years, the ladies of St. Peter's LWML and supporting circles, located in Conover, NC and part of the Foothills Zone, have been collecting dimes in a small red stocking and turning the money in at Christmas for Mites. Upon inquiry of a few other societies in our area and Paula Daniels, President of the Carolinas District- LWML, it appears that no one is familiar with this program. Evidently, it was a program that began in the Carolinas District, since Intl LWML does not show that it was one of its programs.

Paula asked if I (Jan Sigmon, President of St. Peter's LWML) would submit a write-up about the program to be sent to other societies in case there is an interest in this. The premise of the Mite stocking is to place a dime in it for each month of the year. For example, 1 dime for January, 2 for February, and so on. Personally, I put every dime in my change into the stocking. If you only place a dime for each corresponding month, the total at the end of the year will be \$8.70. The combined total of the red stockings is then sent to the Carolinas District which keeps 75% and 25% goes to Intl LWML.

1. **Mites**—Due as soon after collection as possible. Please send mites by the end of each month they are collected.
2. **LWML Sunday Contributions**—Due as soon after collection as possible.
3. **Lutheran Women Quarterlies**—Due by March 1 each year.
4. **Carolinas Cross Connection (CCC)**—Due by March 1.
5. **LWML Delegate Fund**—Due by April 30 each year.
6. **Camp Counselors Support**—Due by May 31 each year.
7. **Mission of the Quarter**—Payable before the quarter begins, anytime during the quarter, but due no later than 15 days after the end of each quarter.
8. **Registration Fees**—Due as publicized for each District Event.
The current biennium runs from September 1, 2022 to August 31, 2024.

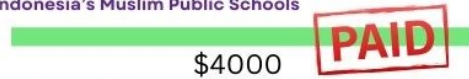

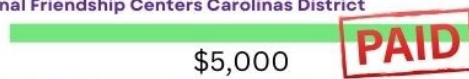

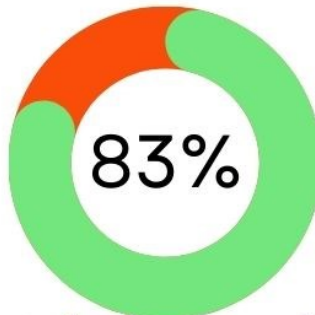

January/February/March 2024 Eastern Catawba Cooperative Ministry (ECCM), Newton, NC

ECCM began in 1969 as a crisis ministry funded and operated by local churches, including Concordia Lutheran Church in Conover and the Dorcas Society of Concordia. It has grown through the years: more people live in the area, many jobs were lost or devalued when manufacturing landscape changed, and consequently there is more poverty and hunger. Typical assistance (motto is "A helping hand up, not a hand out") consists of food, clothing, referrals, life skills coaching, and assistance with utility bills. For many years, much of Catawba County was served by a sister organization, Cooperative Christian Ministry of Hickory (CCM), while ECCM ministered to crisis needs in the rest of the county. However, recently CCM closed its food pantry and clothing ministry in order to focus entirely on its medical clinic outreach. This leaves ECCM, still supported by local churches and staffed mostly with volunteers, to respond to the crisis needs of persons throughout Catawba County. It is a recognized 501(c)3 organization with nearly all donations going directly to clients.
