YouthLead is an annual church leadership program designed for High Schoolers to help them grow in their faith and leadership skills so that our youth are better equipped to lead and share their faith with their church and community.

We will have the opportunity to preview the New Orleans area where we'll spend a week in 2025 for the National Youth Gathering! To date we have raised a little over \$1000 with the one fundraiser we have held, in addition to a few donations. Upcoming opportunities include the SuperBowl charcuterie boards and sponsorships. Our youth will present these opportunities as they become available.

Hymn Corner

"On Eagles' Wings" (LSB 727) (main text by Samuel J. Eatherton) Director of Music, Chris Schelp

Composer and author Jan Michael Joncas (b. 1951), a Roman Catholic minister, tells the story behind the creation of this song: "Around 1977 I visited a friend with whom I had attended college seminary here in St. Paul, MN, as he was doing graduate seminary studies at Theological College at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC. We had gone out for dinner and when we returned to the dorm there was a message waiting for him that his father had had a heart attack. We talked and prayed and checked for flights back to Omaha for him that evening, and he flew home the next day. The song was generated between that evening and the wake service held in Omaha after my friend's father's death." The song was first sung at that funeral service. Psalm 91, the basis for the verses, is a psalm appointed for Night Prayer (Compline) in the Liturgy of the Hours of the Roman Rite. Joncas had been praying it for some time when the opportunity arose to set it in this way. Psalm 91 testifies to the security of all who place their trust in God. The shelter of God can be understood literally as His temple or figuratively as His protection. A New Testament perspective may interpret the shelter as the Church, guarding and preserving the people of God through the Word and Sacraments.






