#### **Holy Communion**



## **Prodigious Profession**

My church has a great theology on prayer. Do you know what it is that I don't do enough? How does prayer become something you yearn to do? Try this. Recognize Who He is and who you are, tell Him your allegiance, thank Him for his grace, faithfulness, and goodness, tell your struggles, pray for others along with yourself, ask His advice. And then read His Word. Most Christians say they have the experience of reading a passage for the umpteenth time and suddenly seeing something new. That's the Holy Spirit! God will respond to your prayers in some way. And even when He's silent, you still remember He is close as the mention of His name. Soon you'll be saying like Luther, "I know not where God leads, but well I know my Guide." Pray before you witness. Soon prayer becomes so near to your life, that it won't be hard to pray with someone who needs a prayer.

# Hymn Corner "Jesus, Thy Blood and Righteousness" (LSB 563)



The precise inspiration for this hymn is unknown. However, Count Nicolaus Ludwig von Zinzendorf (1700-1760), on a trip to Copenhagen in 1731, met a black slave from the island of St. Thomas, who urged Zinzendorf to help spread the Gospel among the slaves in the West Indies. This proved to be a life-changing moment for Zinzendorf, who, from that time forward, focused his energies on worldwide Christian missions. In 1739, he visited a mission he had founded on St. Thomas, and he wrote this hymn on his return voyage across the Atlantic. It is fortunate for English-speaking peoples that John Wesley encountered members of Zinzendorf's fellowship while sailing to Georgia in 1735. He was the finest translator from German of his day. Wesley translated 24 of Zinzendorf's original 33 stanzas for this hymn in a 1740 collection, of which we sing six stanzas (Wesley's 1-2, 7-8, 12, and 21). Zinzendorf was a leader

of the Moravian Church, a Pietist offshoot of German Lutheranism. He was convinced of the ecumenical power of hymn singing and its ability to unite Christians of all traditions. In this hymn there is, thankfully, little evidence of the more extreme subjectivity of many Pietist hymns; rather, the sinner is pointed to the blood of Jesus as the sole source of redemption and comfort.
