Prodigious Profession

Romans 8 is a favorite chapter for living the Christian life. Buried in it is the most astounding statement, Rom8:28: "For those who love God, all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose." This isn't some platitude that some of the good we do will be remembered and is part of God's plan. God says, "All things" Even the ugly stuff, your worst failure, your most vexing sin, your stupidity, works together within God's intricate plan for history. Apostle John, in his gospel, gave a very personal resurrection story of he and Peter finding Jesus' grave cloths. Dead people were wrapped in strips of rag cloth, round and round like a mummy. "He saw the linen cloths lying in the grave and the face cloth which had been on Jesus' head in its folds in a place by itself." John 20:7. "In its folds" (Greek) means perfectly like it was prior. But how do you unwrap strips around a head and then refold it perfectly back into a shell? John says (using the 3 rd person) "he saw and believed." No human could have done this. In a second, God took John's worst personal tragedy and turned it into the Triumph Of His Life. Could God do this for you? Romans 8:28 stunningly says HE WILL. So as we are called to share God's story wherever we go, keep doing it!



Hymn Corner

"At The Lambs High Feast We Sing" (LSB 633)
(main text by Richard J. Serina Jr.)
Director of Music, Chris Schelp

This hymn (the original Latin text of which dates to perhaps as early as the 5th century, and certainly from before the year 800) reflects the ancient Christian observance of the catechumenate. After a period of catechesis, converts joined the Church in the waning darkness of Easter dawn. Following Baptism, the neophytes were clothed in clean white garments, representing their newfound righteousness in Christ, and were ushered in the earliest hours of the morning to the assembly of believers to receive the Eucharist. The Easter Vigil is the modern parallel to this service and retains many of the ancient ceremonies, including a service of Holy Baptism and the reading of Israel's deliverance through the Red Sea from Exodus 14-15, both of which help to illuminate this hymn. The text begins by calling attention to the One who presides at His table: Christ who gives His body and blood to His Church. Stanza 3 calls to mind the Passover of Israel and her rescue from death through the blood of a slain animal, a foreshadowing of the Passover sacrifice of our Easter Lamb, Jesus Christ. Stanzas 5 through 7 locate this hymn in the Church's Easter worship. The Son of God incarnate now treads over hell's fierce powers. On account of Jesus' resurrection, no longer can death appall, for the baptized die in the expectation that they shall rise. Stanza 7 returns to the catechumenate, where not just the neophytes but all Christians are "newborn souls"

through the Easter victory of Jesus, which alone can destroy sin.
