BREAKING GENERATIONAL POVERTY IN DETROIT

Camp Restore Detroit, Michigan | \$58,988

Camp Restore, a Recognized Service Organization (RSO) of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS), is located in what was the most violent area of Detroit, the 9th Precinct. Looking at the physical appearance of the area, it may look like a lost cause. However, there is a strong resilience in this community and strong community leaders. They have the goal of uplifting one another by investing in the people and the places in the neighborhood.

The goal of this LWML Mission Grant is to work in partnership with families and community leaders to break the cycle of poverty by providing a Christ-centered atmosphere full of God's love and grace where families can learn and grow, with access to the needed education and resources. Through education and God's love, the cycle of generational poverty can be broken.

Hymn Corner

"Joyful, Joyful We Adore Thee" (LSB 803)
(main text by Gregory Just Wismar)

Crafting a Christian hymn text for use with a melody composed for a well-loved but non-Christian poem was the challenge taken up by Henry van Dyke, a noted American clergyman of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Many writers had previously attempted to pen Christian words to Beethoven's "Hymn to Joy" from the last movement of his Ninth Symphony, but it was van Dyke's effort, first published in 1911, that met with wide acceptance. LSB contains two significant textual changes to the original. The first is the omission of the original stanza 4. The second is the replacement of the last half of stanza 3 with a more Trinitarian text (which also eliminated some wording that could unfortunately suggest incorrect theology) written by Stephen Starke, who chaired the LSB Hymnody Committee.
