# **Hymn Corner**

"Oh, For a Thousand Tongues to Sing" (LSB 528) (main text by John W. Matthews, Jr.) Director of Music, Chris Schelp

Charles Wesley (1707-88) wrote "For the Anniversary Day of One's Conversion" in 1739, one year after his own conversion on May 21, 1738. The original poem was eighteen stanzas in length; the closing stanza in LSB is actually the first stanza of Wesley's text. Stanzas 2 through 6 of the original highlight Wesley's own subjective experience of conversion; for Lutherans, who trust the objective promises of God in Word and Sacrament, such sentiments would not be suitable for corporate worship. Thankfully, though, the stanzas that are included in LSB are free from such subjectivity; they clearly proclaim Christ crucified for the forgiveness of sins. Wesley was certainly strongly influenced by Pietism; however, in contrast to some Pietists who emphasized the role of obedience in justification, he was clear about his salvation coming about solely through the blood and work of Christ, as is evident in stanza 4: "His blood can make the foulest clean; His blood avails for me."
