PASTOR'S MESSAGE

SEPTEMBER 2023

Let's keep on trying to answer some of the tough questions that we, as Christians, may encounter. This month's question, **"Why is Jesus the only way?"**

We could just say, "Because Jesus said so and quote John 14:6, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.'" But, while true, it could be said to be a bit snarky. Still, it is important for us to affirm that they are right; Jesus is indeed the only way. John 14:6 is an excellent verse to prove that.

Given our (at least supposedly) tolerant society, telling other people they are wrong about such deeply personal things like religion is considered to be highly offensive. That is something we want to keep in mind when talking to others about Jesus and especially when answering questions like, "Why is Jesus the only way?" They may feel that we are, in effect, telling people they are going to hell just because they don't believe in Jesus. Even if that is not precisely true, they might feel that way, so we want to be sure to talk to them with gentleness and respect [1 Peter 3:16] even as we speak the truth in love. [Eph 4:15]

But "Why is Jesus the only way?" In short, because all ways to God are by nature mutually exclusive to one degree or another. If one person says, "Jesus is the only way," and another says, "Jesus is not the only way," only one of them can be correct. Many people consider all religion to be the same or say such things as, "All paths lead to heaven," but that simply cannot be the case.

If Islam maintains that obedience to Muhammed is essential and Christians maintain that we owe our duty to Jesus alone and Latter-Day Saints maintain that we must conform to all Joseph Smith commanded, it becomes immediately obvious that to follow one necessarily means rejecting the others. If nothing else, those three worldviews have wildly different understandings of who Jesus is. A follower of Islam says He is prophet, but not God. A Latter-Day saint would say Jesus one God among many. But a Christian will say that Jesus is the one and only God. Some people might say that spiritual things don't have to adhere to truth as we normally understand it. We could just ask them why they believe that and go on from there. But we could also

show them religions don't just differ on how they understand God, but on how their understanding affects how they live their lives. For example, if we believe, rightly, that God strongly condemns abortion and do what we can to prevent it, many of the same people that think all religions are the same will suddenly have a major issue with our religion.

There are, of course, many other reasons Jesus is the only way, a primary one being that faith in Jesus is the only means by which our sin could be paid, but addressing the points suggested above is a method that doesn't require the people we talk to have knowledge of the Bible so can be a bit easier.

In July 2023 Grace Lutheran Church experienced Plate Contributions of **\$10,114.20** versus Expenses of **\$14,760.73** resulting in a **\$4,646.53 operating deficit**. GCCC raw income came in at **\$66,458.00** versus raw expenses at **\$58,155.39** resulting in a **\$8,302.61 operating surplus**. Combined results for GLC and GCCC, then, is a **\$3,656.08 operating surplus**.

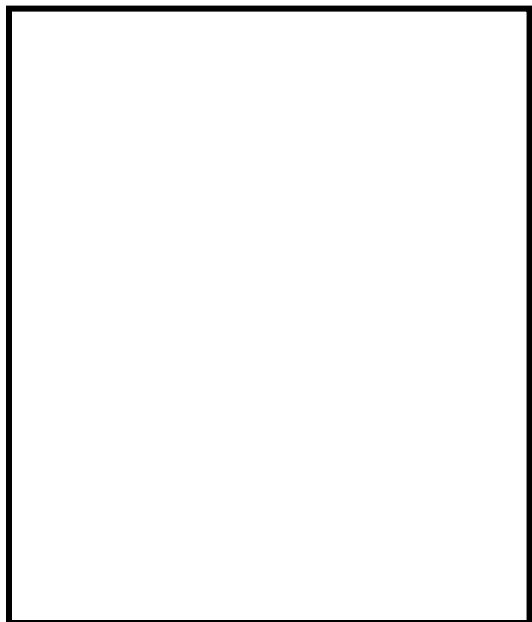

Thank you, Phil!

We could not let Phil Soth step down from his position as the church Treasurer without expressing our gratitude for all he has contributed in time and expertise to Grace Christian Children's Center.

Many of you are unaware of the countless hours Phil spent a few years ago rebuilding our client accounts in QuickBooks. The previous director had not backed up any files for several months, so when her computer failed, we lost everything. The accounts had to be entered manually with information from hard copies of our billing. This was a tedious and very time-consuming process.

A few months after the computer failure, we had the devastating fire at GCCC. Phil handled the insurance claims and all the ensuing issues in the months as we rebuilt and recovered from this tragedy.

Last spring, we changed our billing program to a new more encompassing program. It seemed to be a good program when we looked at the initial information. Unfortunately, the one weakness in this program is its accounting. Very soon we discovered shortcomings and inaccuracies that made keeping accurate records very difficult. It would have been a huge undertaking to return to our old system, so Phil began working to ensure that our financial information was correct. He developed several spreadsheets which he uses to transfer the information from the accounting system into usable data that can then be integrated into the church's accounts. It was a very stressful time with no help from the software company. Phil now has an accurate method of handling the resources from GCCC. The new Treasurer will benefit greatly from all his hard work and knowledge.

More recently, we had the sudden change in leadership at GCCC. At that time, we realized that to continue and retain our staff it was necessary to restructure our payroll. Phil completed a new payroll structure which now has us following the district guidelines for our employees.

It should be obvious that Phil has worked tirelessly (well he is tired!) behind the scenes to help GCCC grow and thrive as our outreach to the community. These are just a few of the contributions he has made. We would not be the success we are today without Phil Soth.

I AM NEVER ALONE

In the first article, I described the current identity crisis that is plaguing our culture today, along with the Biblical answer that our identity is in Christ (see Gal 2:20). Now I want to start discussing 12 key truths regarding our identity in Christ, the next in sequence being that I am never alone. This article is a slightly edited version of an article taken from the book “Flip the Script: Disrupting Tradition for the Sake of the Next Generation”, by Chuck Peters, Jana Magruder, and Stephanie Salvatore.

God is always with you.

At a time when people, and especially our youth, feel like they are all alone, distant, or in isolation from others, they need to know the identity of the One true God – the One who will never abandon them. Let’s read some Scriptures below that speaks to this truth.

PS 139, 7-12 Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? 8 If I ascend into heaven, You are there; If I make my bed in hell, behold, You are there. 9 If I take the wings of the morning, And dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, 10 Even there Your hand shall lead me, And Your right hand shall hold me. 11 If I say, “Surely the darkness shall fall on me,” Even the night shall be light about me; 12 Indeed, the darkness [e]shall not hide from You, But the night shines as the day; The darkness and the light are both alike to You.

Duet 31: 7-8 Then Moses called Joshua and said to him in the sight of all Israel, “Be strong and of good courage, for you must go with this people to the land which the Lord has sworn to their fathers to give them, and you shall cause them to inherit it. 8 And the Lord, He is the One who goes before you. He will be with you, He will not leave you nor forsake you; do not fear nor be dismayed.”

IS 41: 8-10 But you, Israel, are My servant, Jacob whom I have chosen, The descendants of Abraham My friend. 9 You whom I have taken from the ends of the earth, And called from its farthest regions, And said to you, ‘You are My servant, I have chosen you and have not cast you away: 10 Fear not, for I am with you; Be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you, Yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with My righteous right hand.’

PS 23: 1-4 The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want. 2 He makes me to lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside the still waters. 3 He restores my soul; He leads me in the paths of righteousness For His name’s sake. 4 Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.

God promises to always be with us no matter what happens because that is who He is. He is the God of fierce loyalty. When we face

the unknown, God is there. When try to run, hide, rebel, and fight against Him, God is still there. His steadfast faithfulness never diminishes, no matter what. He is always faithful, and He is ever-present.

We see the identify of this promise reflected in the identify of Jesus. The prophet Isaiah foretold of the coming Messiah who would be called Immanuel (Isaiah 7:14). Immanuel – God with us – came to make a way for us to be with God forever.

God is not distant. He is near. He sees, He hears, and He loves.

You are never alone.

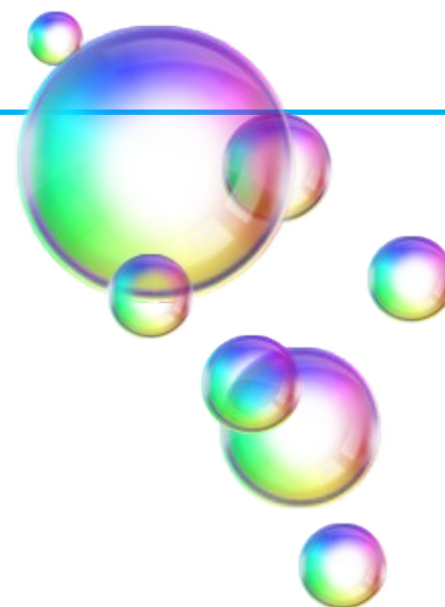

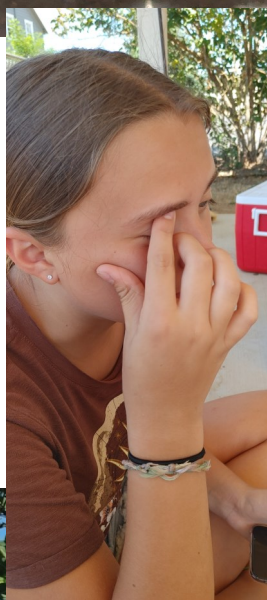
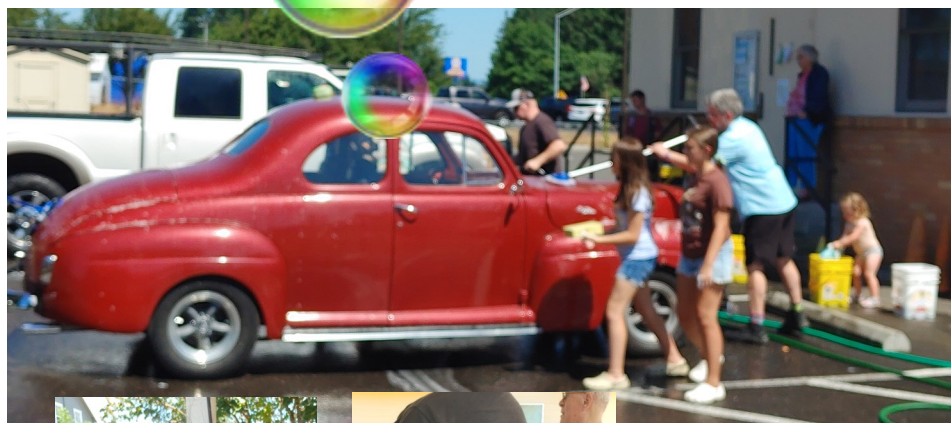
