
PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Let's continue to explore some of the challenging questions we Christians might face as we live our live for our Lord and Savior. This month, "How are Christians called to engage culture?"

It would seem to be rather clear that in many ways we simply do not live life the same way Jesus did. For example, Paul commanded his readers to "Greet one another with a holy kiss." [2 Cor 13:12] Yet, in our culture, it is perfectly acceptable to shake hands. Kissing was the common greeting in those days, shaking hands is now.

Even some of the most moving stories in the Bible will affect us differently the people Jesus originally interacted with because we do not live in the same culture Jesus did. Consider the account of Jesus washing His disciples' feet. [John 13:1-20] In those days, washing people's feet was necessary because people traveled by foot for the most part and that in sandals. Consequently, people's feet got very dirty. When Jesus washed His disciples' feet, they weren't surprised that that feet were being washed for they had that done to them countless times in the past, but they were shocked that Jesus, their Lord, was washing their feet. Usually that task was left for the lowliest of slaves.

Even though Jesus directly said, "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet.", it doesn't seem likely Jesus intended for us, in our current culture, to

physically wash each other's feet as it is now unnecessary. Certainly there is something for us to learn; namely, If Jesus is truly our Lord, we will live like Him and obey Him.

So when Jesus said, "Whoever would be great among you must be your servant, and whoever would be first among you must be slave of all." [Mark 10:43-44], we strive to obey Him, but not by washing feet but serving others. For us foot washing might look more like teaching our youth, singing in the choir, serving on a board or helping host a funeral. We may enjoy those things, but nonetheless doing those things is serving others.

Like Paul said, "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves." [Phil 2:3] Really living like that, not reluctantly or under compulsion, might be hard, but that may indeed be the point. Sometimes we might not deeply desire to serve others, but that can be a part of being servant, serving when we might want to do other things.

Paul also spoke about this in another way. "To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though not being myself under the law) that I might win those under the law. To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (not being outside the law of God

but under the law of Christ) that I might win those outside the law." [1 Cor 9:21-22]

To the Jews, Paul was unmistakably acting immorally by doing such things as not insisting that all Christians get circumcised. Likewise, to the Gentiles (those not under the law) Paul was commanding them to exclusively limit sex to one's spouse which they may have considered a denial of a natural pleasure.

It seems like we find ourselves in much the same situation as Paul, living in a culture, or even cultures, with which we might have a hard time rightly associating. But it seems the only thing we know we can do is obey Jesus when He spoke clearly. When someone asked Jesus, "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets." [Matt 22:26-40]

So if whatever we would do would show love, God's definition of love, we do it. If what we want to do would violate one of God's laws, it would not show love and so we must not do it. For a partial list of acts that are against the love of God look to such places as Galatians 5:19-21 and 1 Corinthians 6:9-10.

While all that might sound like people would accept it and us, we can't forget that showing God's definition of love and rejecting anything that goes against will not look loving to many. People hated Paul for what He did; they thought he was the one being unloving.

Like Jesus said, "If the world hates you, know that it has hated me before it hated you. If you were of the world, the world would love you as its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you." [John 15:18-19] But in the end, we live for God not other people because God alone is our

In November 2023 Grace Lutheran Church experienced Plate Contributions of \$7,945.39 versus Expenses of \$13,552.48 resulting in a \$5,607.09 operating deficit. GCCC raw income came in at \$58,090.00 versus raw expenses at \$47,208.27 resulting in a \$10,881.73 operating surplus. Combined results for GLC and GCCC, then, is a \$5,274.64 operating surplus.


In January, Clark Signs will start construction on the new church sign out front. Watch the transformation happen!
