

The Apostles' Creed: God the Son, Our Redeemer

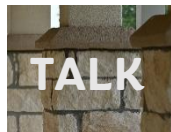


Share a time in your life when you did something that embarrassed you. Now share a time in your life when you did something you were proud of what you had done.

❖ We are **JUSTIFIED** by Christ: **JUST** as **IF I'd** never sinned?

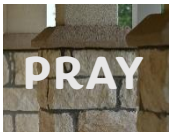

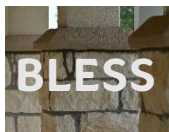
