Thoughts from Pastor Bryant

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God – not the result of works, so that no one may boast." Ephesians 2:8-9 (NRSV)

Every fall, when we begin to teach some Reformation history to our 9th grade Confirmation students, one of the first things Pastor Shannon and I have to confront is the fact that not many of them know much about Martin Luther. When asked, "Who was Martin Luther?" most of them respond with information about Martin Luther King, Jr. I'm certainly pleased that they know something about the American pastor and civil rights leader from the 20th century, but it's important that they also know about that man's name-sake.

There may also be many of you who don't realize that Martin Luther King, Jr. was not born with that name. Michael King, Sr. was a pastor at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta in the 1920's. When his first son was born in 1929, he named him Michael King, Jr. In 1934, Michael King, Sr. traveled to Germany for a gathering of the Baptist World Alliance. While there, he learned about the threat of Nazism and the rise of antisemitism in 1930's Germany. He was also inspired by learning more about the faithful protest of Martin Luther, the German monk and priest who stood up against oppression in the 15th century. Upon returning home, he changed both his and his young son's names from Michael to Martin Luther.

I don't expect you all to rename yourselves or your children, and I certainly don't want to promote an unhealthy amount of pride over our Lutheran namesake. There are problematic parts of our Lutheran heritage as well. It should be noted that, while one man was being inspired to change his name, who's son would go on to be the most well-known advocate for peace and justice of his time in our country, the Nazis themselves were using some of Martin Luther's own antisemitic words to promote their own agenda of hatred to the German people. We must always be wary not to idolize Martin Luther to an unhealthy degree, and we need to continue to repent of those parts of our heritage that have brought about sin and death.

In spite of these complexities, however, and in a time when denominational identity is less and less important to many people, I'd like to encourage you all to consider what it means to call ourselves Lutherans. I'd like you all to know more about this rich tradition of theological insight combined with faithful action that has witnessed to the gospel and transformed the world for over 500 years. It's not an exaggeration to say that the actions of Martin Luther and other brave reformers changed the world. They challenged the authority of the church at the time, which had been corrupted by greed, and empowered ordinary people to read and understand for themselves the message of God's love and grace in Christ. This emphasis on the education and empowerment of all people would have far-reaching consequences in nearly every aspect of Western society. It ought to continue to inspire us today to live as bold witnesses to the truth of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection.

If you'd like to learn more about Martin Luther and Lutheranism, I hope you'll pick up a copy of "Together by Grace: Introducing the Lutherans," edited by Kathryn Kleinhans, available in the church office, and join us for further discussion at SALT (Sharing and Learning Together) on Sunday mornings at 9:00 a.m. through the month of October.

Thoughts from Pastor Shannon



I have been reading up on the history of Halloween as we prepare for "Trunk or Treat" on October 31. It actually is kind of neat to read about the history of how carving jack o' lanterns came to be a thing or how candy corn was originally called

"chicken feed". I was mostly interested in the narrative and stories surrounding Halloween and its evil. There has been a culture war over this holiday for decades, that by somehow participating in it you are worshiping the devil or invoking evil spirits. While some traditions probably do have a tinge of evil related to them, most traditions have developed into fun, light-hearted events like "Trunk or Treat".

The origins of Halloween date back to the Celts of ancient Ireland, when they celebrated their New Year on November 1. They celebrated the end of warm summer months leading into the dark days of winter which was often associated with death. They celebrated on October 31, which they called "Samhain". Their traditions became known as the night when ghosts/spirits/the dead would return to walk the earth because the boundary between the living world and the dead world had become thin.

Centuries later, as Christianity extended its influence into the Celtic lands, "Samhain" became associated with "Halloween". Also known as "All-Hallows-Eve", since we celebrate "All Saint's Day on November 1. While the fun traditions we have for Halloween like bobbing for apples, black cats, telling spooky ghost stories, and wearing fun superhero costumes have no real tie to the Christian faith, the Christian influence on the holiday can be seen in a lot of ways.

There are a few stories of how the tradition of "trick or treating" came to be; one is called the "act of souling" which is linked to 15th-century Christians who would go door to door asking for treats or "soul cakes". They would take the cakes in exchange for a promise to pray for the souls of those homeowners' dead relatives.

We might not pray for a dead relative as part of the Lutheran Christian tradition, but we do remember them and celebrate their life on November 1. We honor them and remember how they taught us about what it means to live a Christian life. Some of us still

visit the grave of loved ones and bring flowers or other mementos as we recall how much they meant to us. And when I think of Halloween in that light, I can't help but think about my grandmother. The one who made my sister and me Halloween costumes when we were young. She was an example in my life of what it meant to be loved as Christ loved us and of her forgiving nature. Was she the perfect saint? No, none of us are, but that is the beauty of celebrating and remembering the Saints of God. None of us are perfect, but we all have something to learn from those who died in faith before us. We all are Saints in the eyes of God despite our sinful nature.

The lines over the centuries might have become pretty blurry between "Samhain" and "Halloween". The traditions surely do not hold the same meaning, yet I see the joy on kids' faces on Halloween. It brings people together in an age when being together has not always been easy. And anything that brings people together in this day and age is an opportunity for ministry. And, for the love of Christ to be extended through our actions and that is a pretty amazing and wonderful thing.

Reflector Changes

We estimate a yearly savings of around \$1,000 by making this change.




Please note that we do NOT list the names of youth by the pictures we use. The exception to this is the confirmation class picture and the Baccalaureate class picture.


