Thoughts from Pastor Bryant

At a recent Lutheran Men in Mission Bible Study, as we pondered and prayed about the many ways that the world seems to be suffering right now, someone dared to wonder where God is in all of this. The Bible tells many stories of God intervening, to either rescue people or punish wrongdoers. Why doesn't that seem to happen anymore? Can we expect miracles to happen? Has God simply stepped away from the world? Maybe you have had similar thoughts and questions while watching the news, scrolling through your social media feed, or enduring your own suffering.

As Christians, we point to three major events that reveal God's presence two us. The first is when God "puts on flesh" (the fancy theological term is "incarnation") and becomes human in Jesus of Nazareth. This radical act of love reassures us that God has not forgotten human beings or abandoned the world. God comes to dwell with us, and does so as the humble child of Mary, raised as a carpenter's son. He lives a simple life amongst the ordinary people of his time. He preaches and teaches about God's love for all people and encourages his followers to perform acts of mercy, hospitality, compassion, kindness, generosity, and justice.

Even more amazingly, the second major event we point to is when Jesus, God in flesh, offers his very life for the reconciliation of humanity to God through his death on the cross. It is not enough for God to simply live and teach and preach among us, but Jesus also suffers with us and dies for us. And if that weren't enough, Jesus is raised to new life on Easter Sunday so that we, too, can have the promise of eternal life beyond death. This event of Jesus' death and resurrection becomes the clearest revelation of God's response to the brokenness and suffering of the world. When we wonder if God is going to show up, we look to the cross and empty tomb.

Finally, after his resurrection, Jesus promises to always be with his disciples. Even as he ascends to heaven, he sends the Holy Spirit to give them power, strength, comfort, and peace. We point to this event of Pentecost as the third way that we know God is at work in the world, which is through Jesus' followers. As we reflected on this presence of God through Christian community in our Bible study that morning, I know I wasn't the only one who was a little mistyeyed in hearing how the care and support of others had helped see people through difficult things in their

lives. I'm sure you can call many similar instances to mind in your own life, where someone's words or actions made a huge difference to you. Do not underestimate the power of even small acts done in kindness, in the Spirit of Christ. There are miracles happening all around us, every day, as people like you follow the way of Jesus.

As we near the end of the year, you will see a display in the entryway of our building to update you on our budget and finances. As is the case every year, we have accumulated a deficit during the summer months that we must make up through generous giving in November and December. To help achieve this goal of balancing our budget for the year, we've brought back the "Pastors' Stewardship Challenge." There will be 200 envelopes hanging on a bulletin board near the sanctuary throughout the month of November, each one marked with a dollar mount 1-200. We encourage you to take an envelope (or more) and return it with that dollar amount in it. Every gift, large or small, adds up, and when all the envelopes have been returned, we will have raised \$20,100. Thank you for all the ways you strive to make a difference in the world by living out your faith! Every day is a new day at Gloria Dei!

Thoughts from Pastor Shannon

4-5 All you saints! Sing your hearts out to God! Thank him to his face!

He gets angry once in a while, but across a lifetime there is only love.

The nights of crying your eyes out give way to days of laughter.

Psalm 30: 4-5 (The Message)



Psalm 30:5 is one of my favorite Bible verses (sort of like how Pastor Bryant's favorite Sunday is every Sunday, I like almost all the Psalms.)
I like them because they are music and poetry. I like them because they put into words so much of our human experiences:

sorrow, pain, laughter, and rejoicing can all be found in the book of Psalms.

In worship, we read the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible (or NRSV for short.) Psalm 30:5b reads: "Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning." How often have so many of us found ourselves surrounded by sorrow and tears, especially in the darkness of the night? This verse speaks to sorrow not lasting, but joy coming with the rising sun. "The Message", a more modern translation of the Bible, says our sorrow, our tears will give way to days of laughter.

Often, I need to be reminded that sorrow, pain, and tears will not last forever. That laughter and joy can be found on the other side of our perspective. Thanksgiving is a time to reflect and be thankful for all the good things that God has done for us in Christ Jesus. Sometimes, as we go into the holiday season, our hearts can feel heavy because with celebration can come sorrow and tears. There might be people you are missing who physically cannot be there with you or sadly they are no longer with us. Even though we know the Saints of God are always with us, their physical absence can be hard.

Psalm 30 reminds us there can still be joy and laughter to be found in those moments. As we sing thanks to God with all the saints, pain does not last forever. Because in Christ there is love eternal, one in which

we know while life can be hard, it can also be full of good things.

Thanksgiving is a time to gather with friends and family to celebrate old traditions and make new ones as well. May you be surrounded by the love of Jesus as you gather and give thanks to God. May your hearts be full of joy and laughter because you know love that surpasses all of our deepest understanding. Love that comes to us new each day at the dawn of new light.



Thanksgiving Eve Worship And Pie Social


Join us for Thanksgiving Eve worship service at 6:30 pm on Wednesday, November 22.

The Church in the World committee appreciates your continued support of projects that are making an impact both with our members and also members of our community. Two upcoming projects that will happen ahead of the holidays:

- Redwood Area Food Shelf Turkey Sponsorship: Soon you will see our turkey display outside the Narthex. This is where you can make a donation to provide a holiday turkey to those in need in our community. It's as easy as taking an envelope and adding your check to it. Checks can be made payable to the Redwood Area Food Shelf. They will in turn purchase turkeys to distribute to families in need. The Adopt-A-Turkey program will run through November.
- <u>Eagles Nest Veterans Supply Drive</u>: Once again, we will be collecting donations for supplies needed at Eagle's Nest Healing Center here in Redwood Falls in time for Veterans Day in November. They are looking for items to fill their supply closet, including cleaning supplies, small bottles of laundry detergent, hand soap, dish soap, paper towels, toilet paper, deodorant, body wash, lotion, snacks, and other hygiene products for both men and women, etc. Please drop off items to the church by November 7.

Backpack Food Program

Gloria Dei continues to collect peanut butter, cereals, granola bars and canned fruits and vegetables for the Reede Gray Weekend Food Backpack program.

The backpack program at Reede Gray School addresses this issue of food insecurity by providing food for the weekends. Lutheran World Relief Mission Sunday November 12

Neighbors in need are waiting for the quilts and kits that have been made by the women of Gloria Dei and other women of the ELCA (WELCA).

Each year, our Mission Quilters and WELCA Circles, and others, pack up quilts and kits to be sent to vulnerable refuges, orphans, communities devasted by natural disasters and confllict, and impoverished families. These quilts and kits reached 361,225 neighbors in 19 countries last year.

In 2022, the Gloria Dei Mission Quilters made 388 quilts and the Circles made 93 care kits.

Gloria Dei will soon be packing up more boxes of quilts and kits to be sent off to the LWR Warehouse in St. Paul after our November 12 Mission Sunday. We have several volunteers that drive loads of quilts and kits to St. Paul for us throughout the year.

Quilting and kit-making doesn't have to be confined to the church basement or fellowship hall. You can make this a family activity.

You can learn more about the work of our quilters and Circles and LWR by checking out the display in the narthex or by going online at lwr.org. Instructions can also be found in our yearly WELCA Handbook.

LWR Shipping Fund Collection \$\$\$

LWR, while grateful to receive quilts and kits, also needs monetary donations to get these supplies into the hands of people who need them.

It costs \$2.25 to deliver 1 quilt oversees. So, in order to get Gloria Dei's 388 quilts loaded up and shipped, LWR needs \$873.00.

Last year, during our Mission Sunday collection, and with your support, we were able to collect \$756.00 for the LWR Shipping Fund. This year, we again want to make a real difference and help with the costs of shipping these items to where they can do the most good.



There will be a display in the narthex in November through the 12th with more information on LWR. Along with information on LWR, making quilts and kits, you will also find a collection jar and envelopes for the LWR Shipping Fund. Envelopes will also be attached to all of the quilts in the sanctuary on November 11 & 12 for ease in making a contribution to the Shipping Fund. If you are able, we would greatly appreciate your contribution towards this shipping fund. If writing a check, please make it out to: "Gloria Dei WELCA", with a note in the memo line "shipping fund". Any amount is appreciated.

It takes very little of the abundance we enjoy to make a difference in the lives of people in the poorest regions of the world. Gloria Dei's women's Circles and Mission Quilters work throughout the year to send gifts of love to those in need.




