Thoughts from Pastor Bryant

For the past seventeen years, there has been a steady presence at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church. Yes, I'm talking about the Holy Spirit, but we all know the Spirit has been working through one particular individual to keep things moving forward during that time, and that's our beloved office coordinator, Deb Kaardal. She's been talking about it with me (threatening it?) for a while, but has now officially submitted her resignation to the church council and announced her retirement, effective December 15.

When I arrived as Gloria Dei's new "lead" pastor in September 2015, with all of seven years' experience at the age of 33, I wasn't quite sure how I would go about "leading" our office staff. I put those words in quotation marks, because after eight years, I can confidently say that I've never led our office staff. Instead, from the very start and every day since, I've been blessed to work alongside talented people who do their work well. Whatever success we've had over that time as a congregation has been thanks to our volunteers and staff, and Deb is certainly tied for first among those who have simply made all the difference in my own work as a pastor. She's taught me how to be a better communicator, how to be more organized, how to plan ahead every once in a while, and how valuable the people are who simply roll up their sleeves and get things done. We've worked together through crises large and small, in the midst of many changes in our lives and in the world. She's shown me grace when I've been late on deadlines (including the one for this Reflector article). She's kindly corrected me when I've been confused on details (again). She's made all of us in the office look much more proficient at our jobs than we sometimes are. We've worked together through lots of laughs, as well as some days of tears (mostly on the part of the pastors). She's been everything you could ask for in a coworker and I can safely say she's had a profound impact on Gloria Dei and on my life. Even as someone who has lots of words (as Deb well knows from editing so many of the things I write), it's impossible for me to fully express how grateful I am for her. I suppose I will simply say, "Thank you, Deb, and God's blessings on your well-deserved retirement!"

Change usually brings a mixture of grief and anxiety, and that's certainly true of Deb's retirement. We have been working to make this time of transition go as smoothly and seamlessly as possible, but we know there will be challenges to overcome. Thank you for

your understanding and grace as we move forward, trying to replace the irreplaceable. It's appropriate that all of this is unfolding during Advent, since Advent is a time when we prepare for the biggest change of all: the arrival of God's kingdom in Christ. God's word reminds us that we are called to navigate even the most tumultuous times with faith and hope, trusting that whatever trials we face now are simply a prelude to the joy of receiving the fulfillment of God's promises. We are called to watch and keep awake, to work toward peace and justice, to generously share what has been entrusted to us, and to let faith cast out our fears. I'm certainly looking forward to a joyous Christmas celebration with you all. May you all receive the greatest gift again into your hearts and homes, knowing that you are loved by God and forgiven in Christ.

As we prepare to have Deb retire, as we make our way through the days of Advent and the excitement of Christmas, as we look toward the unknowns in 2024, may we be reminded of the truth that roots our lives no matter how we feel. Help Achieve

Over the last two years, the Church Council has taken steps to reduce the budget deficient. As we near the end of the year, you have seen a display in the entryway of our building to update you on our budget and finances. As is the case every year, we have accumulated a deficit during the summer months that we want to make up through generous giving in November and December.

To help achieve this goal of balancing our budget for the year, we've brought back the "Pastors' Stewardship Challenge." We started with 200 envelopes hanging on a bulletin board near the sanctuary, each one marked with a dollar amount from \$1-200. We encourage you to take an envelope (or more) and return it with that dollar amount in it. Every gift, large or small, adds up, and when all the envelopes have been returned, we will have raised \$20,100. Thank you for all the ways you strive to make a difference in the world by living out your faith!


Backpack Food Program




