Thoughts from Pastor Bryant

"Then Jesus began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again." – Mark 8:31

As I sit down to write this article, it's still the middle of February, and the season of Lent has just begun. After only a few days, however, there's a part of me that's already longing for the celebration of Easter. Because Easter Sunday is technically still in March this year, I almost allowed myself the indulgence of skipping ahead to write about the resurrection. I can't wait to see our sanctuary decorated beautifully and to sing joyous songs of celebration with so many of you!

That wouldn't be faithful to the gospel, however, and it would leave out the most crucial part of the story. The cross is, quite literally, crucial. The word crucial comes from the root crux, which is the Latin word for cross. We use these words to mean that something is essential, or a central idea, but to say something is "the crux of the matter" or "crucial" comes from the fact that the cross is at the center of our faith. We can't have Christianity without it. We can't have salvation without it. More than that, however, we believe that the cross is at the heart of everything.

I was invited to give a presentation at the Redwood Falls library on a trip I took to the Holy Land back in 2014. It was a great excuse to review all of the pictures I took and relive those amazing experiences. I had forgotten this one, but it seems appropriate as we continue to keep the cross at the center during Lent. In the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (the church built over the place traditionally regarded as the site of Jesus' crucifixion and burial in Jerusalem), Orthodox Christians have placed a stone basin in the center of the sanctuary of the church. The name of this basin is the "omphalos" or "navel." It's a physical reminder that the cross is indeed the center of the world, with Jesus' arms extending to embrace all of creation and humanity.

Even when we celebrate the resurrection, we never forget that it is the one who was crucified who is raised to new life. Even in eternal life, the cross is not left behind. This most horrific act of violence is taken into the heart of God's being to bring us peace in knowing there is nothing that can separate us from God's love in Christ. As Jesus takes on all suffering

and death itself and bears it on our behalf, the cross, then, becomes the center, not only of our faith, but of God's very being and of the entire universe.

I pray that you will know the fullness of joy that comes with celebrating the resurrection of Jesus. Before we get there, however, I also pray that you will know the peace that comes with pondering the cross as the place of our salvation, trusting that God is with you in all things. The cross is the crux of everything.

Thoughts from Pastor Shannon

It is hard to believe March is already upon us. February has flown by rather quickly even with it being a leap year and adding one more day (29) to the month. At the start of March, we find ourselves in the middle of Lent, which will conclude with Easter morning on March 31.

Lent is a beautiful gift in the middle of winter. It helps break up our old routines and gives us something to look forward to whether it is mid-week worship or Easter morning. One thing that has me curious after serving Gloria Dei for the past seven years is Holy Week. The week where we gather and experience Jesus triumphant entrance into Jerusalem. Then move quickly to Maundy Thursday where we hear Jesus establish the Lord's Supper, command us to wash one another's feet, and ultimately give witness of his betrayal to those whom he loved. All in all, those two services are pretty well attended. The tradition Gloria Dei has of Palm Sunday being youth-led worship gives a way for future generations of Christians to experience what it is like to be involved in church in a leadership role. The kids are adorable as they march around the church waving palm branches shouting "Hosanna!" and singing "All Glory, Laud, and Honor."

Maundy Thursday, while not youth-led, does involve our youth in a more intimate way as we commune many children for the first time. What a joy it is to watch young people receive the sacrament of Christ's body and blood; to see them experience God's grace through bread and wine for the first time. We always conclude Maundy Thursday by stripping the altar area. From paraments to candles and even the Bible. One of the most humbling things, as a Pastor, is when Pastor Bryant and I remove our stoles (the colored fabric draped around our necks each time we led worship.) It is a reminder to me of the weight of Christ's sacrifice, not just for all humanity, but for me, as well. That he was mocked and stripped bare to hang on the cross so too must I be stripped of all that ties me to this world including the call to serve Jesus as a Pastor in his church.

These two services during Holy Week are powerful, but what surprises me is the attendance on Good Friday. We may have a quarter of people in attendance compared to the night before. Maybe this is because it's a lot of church in 96 hours. (Thursday-Sunday) I

can understand that as many Holy Weeks I particularly live at the church, but what struck me a few years ago was when I heard someone say, "Good Friday makes me too sad, so I don't come to worship."


It was obvious to me, that sadness is not something any one of us desires out of our worship experience. We want worship to be uplifting and make us feel good. To give us hope for the week and month ahead. Not drag us down and make us contemplate our mortality. And yet, I would argue that perhaps that is one of the things we need to experience before we can celebrate the joy of the resurrection. We need to be able to sit in our sadness of knowing God sent Jesus into the world to die for people like you and me. We need to sit at the foot of the cross and acknowledge that even though we were not there on that fateful night, it is our brokenness that caused this man to die.

I'll admit, Good Friday is not the perfect service to take young kids to. It's quiet and contemplative, which as we all know children are not the best at, and yet, I think it is the place where people of any age should be able to come and worship differently than Sunday morning. To sit with our feelings of grief and sadness. To not simply brush them off but to dwell in them before we can find the joy of Easter morning. If you have not been to a Good Friday service in a while, I would invite you to consider coming to one this year. We cannot have the resurrection without death. We cannot have Christ calling Mary's name in the garden on Easter morning without him first dying and being laid in a tomb.

Good Friday is a reminder to us all that while death is full of grief, sadness, and sorrow it does not last for forever. Weeping will turn to laughter. Mourning will turn to dancing. And when everything feels like it might just be hopeless will find hope that never leaves us, and those are reminders and promises from God we all need throughout this lifetime.

Soup Supper Supplies



Spring Fever Youth Retreat



Let Emily Nelson or the church office know if you have any questions or would like to help.




