Thoughts from Pastor Bryant

“This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one’s life for one’s friends.” – John 15:12-13

If you’re the romantic type, you’ll have February 14th marked on your calendar as a day to express your affection to your true love. If you’re looking to your pastor’s monthly newsletter article to find the perfect Valentine’s Day gift idea, I’m sorry to disappoint you. I don’t have any perfect or uncommon ways to wow your significant other. I’m not even sure I understand Valentine’s Day much anymore since a quick search for gift ideas gave me a website that proclaimed “The best Valentine’s gifts (as in, not the whole teddy bear, chocolate, and roses thing) for galentines, palentines, couples, and anyone you love.” I’m not exactly sure what a palentine is, but I don’t think I have any, and what’s wrong with chocolate?

No, it’s best that I stick to what I know about February 14 this year: it’s also Ash Wednesday. We begin Lent with a reminder of our mortality. Ashes are also a sign of grief from Biblical times. We came from ashes and dust. We will return to ashes and dust. These aren’t exactly the most romantic themes. No one is trying to sell crosses of ashes for Valentine’s Day gifts. They are, however, more important themes when it comes to real love. Real love isn’t just about being swept off your feet with emotion and desire. Real love is about loving a person fiercely and faithfully, even unto death. It’s about giving yourself away, day by day, for the sake of the other. Real love recognizes that the time we have in this world is all too brief, and yet chooses to lay down one’s life for another.

It is not romantic passion that calls us to these radical acts of selfless love. We strive to live and love in this way because God has first shown this love toward us in Jesus. When we place ashes on our brows, we don’t do it to draw attention to ourselves or our own piety. We do it for precisely the opposite reason, to remind ourselves and others that we are sinful and mortal. Apart from God’s love and grace, we are indeed only dust and ashes. Wondrously, God has shown us grace by giving us life now and by the death and resurrection of Jesus, also given us the promise of eternal life beyond death. When we receive this grace by faith, our hearts are transformed to be more compassionate, generous, and loving.

This, then, is the reason why we love and care for others, not because they are attractive, deserving, or even pleasant to be around, but because we strive to embody the self-giving love of God in Jesus. So yes, I hope you have a Happy Valentine’s Day with your significant other or spouse or galentine or palentine or whatever, but I also pray that you remember the greatest love of all, which is given by grace to all people. May we all strive to love in the same way that Jesus has first loved us.

Thoughts from Pastor Shannon

There is a sign in my office right above my computer, that reads, “*You make beautiful things... You make beautiful things out of the dust.*” I found the frame at the discount table at some thrift shop and printed the words on computer paper. It is not very pretty; I think I did that unintentionally.

The words come from a song called, “Beautiful Things” by a band called Gungor. It is one of those songs that haunts you because it is so painfully perfect in describing the human condition. It is like the first time you hear a love song after falling in love. It is the song I never knew my soul needed until I heard it. It is the song that reminds me of creation and death and Ash Wednesday.

We are approaching Lent rather quickly as Ash Wednesday is on February 14th this year. And each year, I am humbled by what it means to be created out of the dust and what it means someday to return to the dust once again. It reminds me of Paul’s words in Romans 14:8 *“If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord; so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord’s.”*

I am God’s. You are God’s. You were lovingly formed from the dust and someday you will return to the dust from which you were formed. Before I return to the dust, I need countless reminders from God in which I am reassured that God does indeed make beautiful things from the dust and that includes me. And it includes you too.

So the not-so-pretty sign hangs in a place where I see it every day as a reminder. Not so much about my physical appearance, but as a reminder that we have a God who takes dust and breathes new life into it. A God who makes all things beautiful and that includes death. A God who reassures us that all that is lost will one day be found. That out of chaos life is being found in Jesus, and I am included in those beautiful new things God does with the dust.

We will gather once again on February 14th as Lent begins. Crosses will be marked on our brows, and we will be reminded once again that we are dust and to dust we shall return. Yet, God takes dust and does extraordinary, beautiful things with it. God creates life so beautiful we cannot exist apart from God. Life that is meant for you and for me.

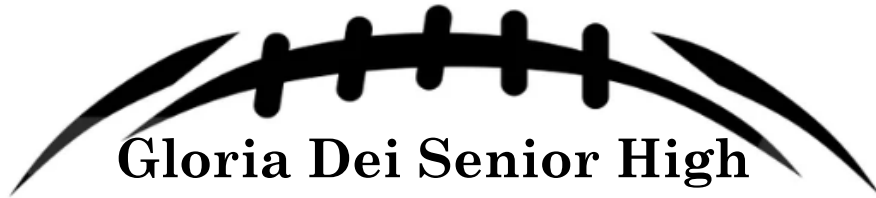


